President's Message

Four championship races in the books so far and Karen is sending you Memo number five. Why does winter take so long to pass and yet our racing season seems to fly by? The next race, at PIR in June, will mark one third of the championship year.

Elsewhere in this Memo you will read reports from our Stewards regarding the very real concerns of driving skill and sportsmanship displayed by a minority of our competitors in the early run to the 2011 championship.

ICSCC is proud that the majority of our racers practice close, competitive, and clean driving. Conference racing has no prize money and is not a feeder series into professional motorsport, yet our success in the Pacific Northwest speaks volumes about our ability to manage the physical and financial risks inherent in competitive motorsport while keeping the fun factor high. The Conference is a member driven organization, and I am confident that you will work with our stewards to continue our success.

Leslie and I left ORP on Sunday afternoon to visit Spokane County Raceways and Northwest Motorsports on the Monday and review the track reconfiguration prior to the first ICSCC Triple Race Weekend on July 15, 16, & 17. The track surface has been paved, but supporting structure, including run-offs and

crash barriers, is not yet complete due to weather and construction delays.

Because of this, the required Track Certification has not been obtained. ICSCC regulations require that the announcement for this race be included in this Memo. Please note that to comply, we have assigned a "tentative" designation to this announcement.

The ICSCC insurance carrier requires all new race tracks and track revisions to be certified before use. NWMS and the SCR contractor are working hard to achieve this certification before the ICSCC P&P mandated date of June 15 when race insurance must be in place. A mailing to all ICSCC registered members will be mailed on June 16th confirming the status of this important event.

Steward's Soapbox

Our first couple of races were pretty rough (literally!). By my count we've got 16 cars with big damage, and I've assessed \$950 worth of fines in just 2 weekends. We had 7 passes under yellow in one race! Justifiably, some people have started to question if this is the

place they want to race. I completely understand their concern and assure all of you that the Stewards will get this under control.

So ask yourself – what makes Conference great? For me, Conference is family. We take care of each other both in the paddock and on the track. That goes for everyone – racers,

corner workers, E-crew, Admin, etc, etc. We treat each other like family and take care of each other when the going gets rough. Well, it's a bit rough right now. Avoidable contact / dangerous driving is not taking care of your fellow racers. Missing really important flags is not taking care of our corner workers and E-crew. Some drivers are worried about entering races, and the safety teams are worried whether it's safe to respond to a car that needs help. We all need to unite and all commit to each other that we're going make a change. A very small number of our family need an intervention. They need to hear from all of us that this isn't how we treat our family. Certainly they will hear it from me, but they need to hear it from the entire paddock. Honestly, it's a heck of a lot more effective coming from fellow drivers than it is coming from the Stewards. We need to protect our relationship at all costs. If it breaks down, Conference will lose a huge part of its magic.

So that's what I ask of you; here's what you can expect from me. I'm going on record right now that I won't allow avoidable contact or people making passes by intimidation to go on. It's poisonous. The Stewards will prosecute bonehead moves very aggressively.

When we find a person at fault for avoidable contact, the penalties are going up exponentially. It used to be \$50 & 1 lap. No more.

Further, if a person's a repeat customer for passes under yellow, the penalty will be very painful. Again, we're pretty much out of \$50 & 1 lap tickets. This isn't vintage racing, and I don't want to

turn it into that, but clearly I need to calm it down a notch. One of my main responsibilities is to keep the racing safe and fun for everyone, and I won't hesitate to protect that.

But let's not end this on a negative. Let me assure you I'm a huge fan of close, clean racing. Contact's going to happen, and if it's inadvertent & small - no harm, no foul. The vast majority of you won't see the Stewards on the wrong side of a turn report, and I completely recognize that. If you make a minor mistake, the response will continue to be measured and fair. I only need to make a statement with the big mistakes. Have fun out there, brother (or sister), and I'll be cheering you on from the pit wall.

INTERNATIONAL RACE DRIVERS CLUB (IRDC) EVENT SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS 2011

- ALL PEOPLE ENTERING PACIFIC RACEWAYS (PR) MUST SIGNA WAIVER AND WEAR A WRISTBAND ON THEIR WRIST AT ALL TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. Entrance to PR on the Friday of a race weekend shall only be allowed after 4:00pm on Friday. Early Friday arrivals (i.e. before 4:00 pm Friday) shall line up until gates open at 4:00pm. Exception being if you are a participant or volunteer worker for Friday Test & Tune.
- 3. There will be no starting of any race engines prior to 9:00 am.
- 4. ICSCC NOISE RULE 1112 enforced! 103db @ 50 ft. No exceptions.
- 5. The "5-Minute Warning" will be given 9 minutes prior to the start of the race to accommodate the 4-minute pace lap.
- 6. If you use the escape road at 3A you will be held at the stop sign for a minimum of 10 seconds prior to re-entry under the direction of the worker at turn station 4.
- 7. Open to cars eligible under ICSCC and SCCA current regulations.
- 8. No class changes after 1:00 pm on Saturday.
- 9. Drivers are responsible for properly and completely filling out their entry registration form(s).
- 10. Multiple Entries: A driver entering the same car in more than one event shall indicate on each entry form whether the entry is for the driver's "primary" or "additional" event. If the entries are oversubscribed for a particular event (entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track) drivers and cars entered as an "additional" event will be restricted from participating on a first come, first served priority based on the date the entries are received. This will allow participation by all drivers and cars for whom the event is their primary event including novices upgrading to a championship event on that weekend.
- 11. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is <u>NOT</u> allowed at any time during the racing event, except in the area covered by the liquor permit issued by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The time and location is a condition of operation of the track and enforced by track officials, ICSCC, IRDC officials or law enforcement.
- 12. All Entrants shall present at tech inspection empty, sealable, container(s) marked with driver's name and car number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PR. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from Pacific Raceways. There will be a \$10.00 per tire charge imposed by the track for the disposal of tires.
- 13. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Any damage to any equipment or devices utilized by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (IRDC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 14. A Minor Release form is required for all minors upon entry to the track. Minors must be under direct supervision of an adult at all times. No minors under 18 years of age are allowed in the hot pits or pre-grid. Operation of any type of wheeled transportation (bikes, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc.) is forbidden for anyone under the age of 16 years.
- 15. A speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced in the paddock.
- 16. No overnight camping at the track on Sunday night without the consent of PR management.
- 17. There will be no refueling in the grid area unless accompanied by a fire extinguisher and operator.
- 18. No motorized tow or support vehicles allowed on pre-grid unless authorized by the Grid Marshall or Raœ Chairman. Support vehicles behind pre-grid must be parked along the fence
- 19. No open fires are allowed in the paddock, pre-grid or within the track in-field.
- 20. All gates are locked at 11:00 pm Friday and Saturday nights. The main gate will open by 7:00 am.
- 21. Only one support vehicle or trailer is allowed in the pits per competition car.
- 22. The length of scheduled events may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions beyond the control of IRDC personnel.
- 23. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to this event to anyone.
- 24. No bicycles, scooters, or walking allowed on the access road adjacent to the main straight from the paddock to pre-grid. This is a PR rule.
- 25. Pets must be leashed at all times and owners are responsible for cleaning up animal waste.
- 26. All in-car timing system transmitter beacons must be placed in the gated area east of the walkway to the Turn 9 grandstands. Transmitters outside of the specified area will be confiscated by the Race Chairman.
- 27. Turn 1 / Pit Out blend line violators will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- 28. All request for split or staggered starts must be made to the Race Stewart before the end of the events on the day prior to the race.
