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License Director

I continue to be impressed by the quality of our 2013 novice class. There are some talented budding racers out there who showed their stuff well at the Military Salute races at Pacific Raceways. Though the forecast for the weekend was a bit iffy, it turned out to be a great weekend.

I am starting to feel a bit jumpy about the flag exercise. As with the first race, what was intended as a learning experience in safely passing a safety vehicle turned into a well timed exercise in getting a car lassoed in turn 2. The novice closed wheel group also got to experience a very slippery situation following a crankcase oiling of the track. Some real pucker moments ensued but all seemed to safely navigate the obstacle. We did have a bit of anxious passing when a yellow came out in T3A so it was a good lesson in paying attention to flags and workers even when vision is fogged by the "red mist".

As we enter late spring and then summer the weather starts to warm up and we all need to really pay attention to hydration. A couple things to keep in mind. First neither caffeine nor carbonated beverages are your friend. They both drain your body of water, which you really need to keep your brain working in the stressful and hot environment of race cars at speed. Brain fade leads not only to poor decisions but can also be downright dangerous to yourself, your competitors and even more importantly to our treasured race workers. Tintops can reach 60 degrees C/ 140 F or more on a hot day and can cook you in your own juices real quick. Which brings me to the second point. You can't adequately hydrate yourself the day of the event or even the day before. You really need to be starting to drink multiple litres of water on Thursday for a Saturday race. Remember the runner's motto:

Pee clear. And do that for 2 days before you get on track!

I want to acknowledge the folks who upgraded following the Military Salute at PR. We had two NCW racers upgrade from Novice to Area Road Racer including James Hudson and Terry Raines. In NOW Dirk Ellis upgraded to ARR. Congratulations to these drivers who join the senior racers on the grid!

Two down; 12 to go! By the time you read this, TC's Bruce Baggett Grand Prix double race weekend will be in the history books and we will be headed back to PIR for Cascade's Chicane Challenge XXI and then on to NWMS's Northwest Grand Prix triple race weekend in July.

To follow up last month's article, I did travel with Andy Collins of Armadillo Racing to the first Aussie V8 Supercars races at the Circuit of the Americas. Andy and I also hung out with Conference racers Rick and Mike Delamare along with their dad Rob and young son Joe. Those cars make great happy noises. 

NWMS Supplemental Regulations 2013

- 1) Open to all cars eligible under ICSCC regulations.
- This event is organized under 2013 ICSCC Competition Regulations and all who enter SCR are subject to them.
 Northwest Motorsports reserves the right to refuse entry to this event at any time.
- People under 18 years old are not allowed in the hot pits, pre-grid or on victory laps. Children less than 12 years old must have direct adult supervision at all times.
- A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult must be on record for all minor participants brought into SCR.
- 5) Alcoholic beverages will only allowed in spectator area and only after the track closes.
- 6) Competition numbers must be readable.
- 7) The scales will be open 8 AM Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday.
- 8) No skateboards or scooters allowed in paddock area. Users of bicycles and small-motorized vehicles may have riding privileges revoked at any time by the Race Chairman.
- Refueling is not allowed in pre-grid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crewmember assigned to operate a fire bottle.
 Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
- 10) No smoking in hot pits, pre-grid or any SCR building.
- 11) Pit and pre-grid roads must remain clear.
- 12) Noise rule ICSCC 1112 enforced. 103.0 dB at 50ft; no exceptions.
- 13) Damage to the track, grounds, buildings, etc regardless of the cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
 Damage to any equipment or devices used by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (NWMS) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 14) All entrants for this event shall present at each tech inspection an empty, sealable container or containers, marked with driver's name, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc from SCR. There will not be drums provided.
- 15) Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from the raceway.
- 16) If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular event, drivers and cars entered as an "additional event" will be restricted from participating on a first come, first served priority based on the date entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by all drivers from whom the event is their primary event, including novices upgrading to a championship event.
- 17) NSF checks will be charged an additional \$50 fee.
- 18) The racing "hot pits" is defined as that area under the control of Hot Pits personnel. Any person over the "pit wall" during practice, qualifying or races shall wear long pants, shirts that cover shoulders, and shall not be barefoot or wear open toed/heeled shoes. At the one minute warning, pre-grid becomes a "hot" area. At that time, pre-grid must be cleared of all crew, support personnel and spectators.
- 19) All cars that are towed into the paddock are subject to being dropped off in impound. Drivers must wear all required driver's safety equipment before they are allowed to enter track, while they are on track, beyond positive protection, under flat tow, or in the hot pits area.
- 20) Blendline- You are required to stay on the right side of the white blendline until the blend line ends. This is required every time you enter the racetrack other than race out lap with race official splitting cars.
- 21) Everyone is required to wear wristband for entry into track. After Friday, no one will be allowed to enter without wristband. \$1 fee per wristband replacement will be administered Saturday and Sunday.



NWMS Supplemental Regulations

2013 Mini Enduro Round 3 Supplemental

Mini enduro rules apply with the addition to the following supplemental rules:

1. Qualifying

- a. 15 minute qualifying session to set the field.
- b. One of both drivers may drive the car during the session with the fastest time set by either driver being used as their qualifying time.
- c. Grid shall be set fastest to slowest.

2. Race

- a. A mandatory pit stop shall be made between the 15 and 45 minute mark of the race. Either a driver change (two drivers) or a 60 second timed stop (one driver) must occur during the mandatory pit stop.
- 3. Spokane Pit Stop/Pit Lane Rules
 - a. Pit lane speed limit 25 mph
 - b. Pit lane speed starts at double orange cones
 - c. While on pit lane, use far left lane except to enter and exit pit stall.
 - d. Pit stalls will be assigned by qualifying position.
 - e. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into its pit stall.
 - f. During a full course yellow, pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a full course yellow, you will be released to join rejoin the field. If a full course yellow or a black/red flag occurs during the mandatory pit stop window, the amount of time under the full course yellow or black/red flag will be added to the end of the window time. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the restart of the race. No work of any kind is allowed under a black/red flag. The clock will continue to run.
- Minimum penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 1 liter Stop and go. Pit stop window violation 2
 minute penalty. All others Warning
- 5. Trophies: One or two in class 1st only; three to five in class 1st and 2nd only; six or more in class 1st, 2nd, and 3d.
- MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING: See schedule. Failure to attend will result in starting at the end of the field.

2013 Hound and Hare Supplemental

- Qualifying Sprint Race
 - a. Gridding set based on race 6 qualifying times.
 - i. Grid shall be set fastest to slowest.
- 2. Hound and Hare Race
 - a. Timed standing start based on Qualifying Sprint Race finish.
 - If any driver pits during the Qualifying Sprint Race, that driver will start from the end of the field, unless all
 cars are required to pit due to an incident.

INTERNATIONAL RACE DRIVERS CLUB (IRDC) SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS 2013 - Pacific Raceways

- ALL PEOPLE ENTERING PACIFIC RACEWAYS (PR) MUST SIGN A WAIVER AND WEAR A WRISTBAND ON THEIR WRIST AT ALL TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. There will be no starting of any race engines prior to 9:00 am.
- ICSCC NOISE RULE 1112 enforced! 103.0 db @ 50 ft. No exceptions.
- 4. The "5-Minute Warning" will be given 9 minutes prior to the start of the race to accommodate the four (4) minute pace lap.
- 5. If you use the escape road at 3A you will be held at the stop sign for a minimum of 10 seconds prior to reentry under the direction of the worker at turn station 4.
- A speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced in the paddock.
- Turn 1 / Pit Out blend line violators will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
 Any damage to any equipment or devices utilized by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (IRDC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- Consumption of alcoholic beverages is <u>NOT</u> allowed at any time during the racing event, except in the area
 covered by the liquor permit issued by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The time and location is
 a condition of operation of the track and enforced by track officials, ICSCC, IRDC officials or law
 enforcement.
- 10. No class changes after 1:00 pm on Saturday.
- 11. All Entrants shall present at tech inspection empty, sealable, container(s) marked with driver's name and car number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PR. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from Pacific Raceways.
- There is to be NO Glycol or Antifreeze in ANY racecar.
- 13. There will be a \$50.00 per tire charge imposed by the track for the disposal of tires.
- 14. Minors (under 18 years of age) must be under direct supervision of an adult at all times. No minors under 18 years of age are allowed in the hot pits or pre-grid. Operation of any type of wheeled transportation (bikes, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc.) is forbidden for anyone under the age of 16 years.
- 15. No overnight camping at the track on Sunday night without the consent of PR management.
- 16. There will be no refueling in the grid area unless accompanied by a fire extinguisher and operator.
- 17. No motorized tow or support vehicles allowed on pre-grid unless authorized by the Grid Marshall or Race Chairman. Support vehicles behind pre-grid must be parked along the fence.
- 18. No open fires are allowed in the paddock, pre-grid, or within the track in-field.
- 19. All gates are locked at 11:00 pm Friday and Saturday nights. The main gate will open by 7:00 am.
- 20. Only one support vehicle or trailer is allowed in the pits per competition car.
- 21. The length of scheduled events may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions beyond the control of IRDC personnel.
- 22. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to this event to anyone.
- 23. No bicycles, scooters, or walking allowed on the access road adjacent to the main straight from the paddock to pre-grid. This is a PR rule.
- 24. Pets must be leashed at all times and owners are responsible for cleaning up animal waste.
- 25. All in-car timing system transmitter beacons must be placed in the gated area east of the walkway to the Turn 9 grandstands. Transmitters outside of the specified area will be confiscated by the Race Chairman.
- 26. All requests for split or staggered starts must be made to the Race Steward before the end of the events on the day prior to the race.

ELIGIBILITY: Licenses – ICSCC IRR/ARR, SCCA, CACC, FIA, ASN or NASA. Other licenses subject to ICSCC License Director approval. No novice license drivers.

ENTRY FEE: \$150.00 USD per car.

FEATURE RACE RULES:

- MANDATORY FEATURE RACE DRIVER'S MEETING will take place immediately following the regular mandatory Saturday driver's meeting. All MINI Enduro drivers must be in attendance.
- Car numbers are assigned in order of entry.
- Regular ICSCC rules apply, except as noted specifically below.
- 4. Entry fee is per car.
- 5. One or two drivers per car.
- 6. Qualifying per Group 8 qualifying session, either driver may qualify the car.
- 7. Pit lane speed limit is 35 mph. Pit lane begins at double cones and ends at re-entry official. Pit lane speed will be strictly enforced. One crew person is allowed "over the wall" to guide the driver into the pit stall. Pit stalls assignments correlate to qualifying position.
- 8. There is a mandatory pit stop required between 25 and 35 minutes elapsed time. Pit stops are permitted outside of the mandatory window, but do not count towards the mandatory stop. This window and procedure may be adjusted as required depending upon total number of entries.
- a. For single driver cars, the car must come to a complete stop in the pit box before a 60 second timed hold begins or you may elect to exit the car, touch the front bumper, and re-enter the car to avoid the 60 second hold. The engine is not required to be shut off if no refueling is taking place. Once 60 seconds has elapsed, the car will be released by the timing official, however it is the driver's responsibility to leave the pit box safely in pit lane traffic.
- b. For two driver cars, the car is permitted to leave the pit box as quickly as the driver exchange can be completed. There is no 60 second hold for two driver cars or single cars choosing to exit, touch the front bumper and re-enter.
- 9. Fueling is permitted, jugs or dump cans OK, no fuel towers. Any crew member having the potential to come into contact with fuel or fuel vapors during pit stops must be attired in safety gear equal to or greater than driver gear. A dedicated crew person with fire bottle required. Driver exchange assistant and windshield cleaning is permitted while fueling. No other work permitted while fueling. No limit to number of crew, however each crew person must have a specific function. Engines must be shut off during any refueling whether single of two driver cars.
- 10. Pit lane will close during Full Course Caution situations. If a FCC occurs during the mandatory pit stop window, the amount of time under FCC will be added to the end of the mandatory pit stop window. Pit lane will not re-open following a FCC until the entire field has taken the green on the restart.
- 11. No work of any kind is permitted under Black or Red flag situations. The race clock will continue to run.
- 12. Any car returning to the paddock will be considered to have withdrawn from the race and will not be permitted to re-enter the circuit.
- 13. Violation of any rule will result in a stop and go penalty assessed during green flag conditions, separate from any pit stop.
