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## REMEMBERING DAN ROWLAND

Conference has now become a venerable organization in that those of us were there at the start are slipping away as the years pass. In recent days we have had to say good-bye to one more pillar that has supported us through many years, Dan Rowland.

Dan was passionate about racing and about Conference, to which he gave many years of his life. He began by taking the Bondurant racing school course at age 18 and raced with Conference first with a Datsun 510 and later with a Datsun 240Z. He won championships with both cars. The 510 in 1978 and the 240Z in 1990.

He also served Conference in administrative functions. He was Assistant Race Steward in 1980 and Race Steward in 1985. According to Bob Grey, the President that year, Dan and his assistant, Wes Tipton, were hugely successful in that they were able to avoid having to run from the angry mob which always seems to be attracted to stewards as the competition year wears on. He went on to serve three one-year terms as President in 1995, '96, and '97. Declining health forced him to curtail his involvement after he left office of President but his heart was always in the sport and the organization.

We send our heartfelt condolences to his widow Diane and we are confident that he is now able to race with all the great drivers and that the machinery and the tires never wear out.

#### INTERNATIONAL RACE DRIVERS CLUB (IRDC) SUPPLEMENTAL REGULATIONS 2013 – The Ridge Motorsports Park

- 1. ALL PEOPLE ENTERING The Ridge Motorsports Park (TRMP) MUST SIGN A WAIVER AND WEAR A WRISTBAND ON THEIR WRIST AT ALL TIMES. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. There will be no starting of any race engines or loud generators prior to 8:00 am.
- 3. ICSCC NOISE RULE 1112 enforced! 103.0 db @ 50 ft. No exceptions.
- 4. The "5-Minute Warning" will be given 9 minutes prior to the start of the race to accommodate the four (4) minute pace lap.
- 5. The racing "hot pit" is defined as that area under the control of Hot Pits personnel. Per ICSCC rule #1607, any person over that "pit wall" during practice, qualifying or races shall wear long pants, shirts that cover the shoulders, and shall not be barefoot or wear open-toed shoes. At the one-minute warning, pre-grid becomes a "hot" area. At that time, pre-grid must be cleared of all crew, support personnel and spectators. Notwithstanding the above, ICSCC rule #1607 does not apply to the pre-grid area.
- 6. Pit Lane speed limit is 35 mph at all times during the weekend.
- 7. A speed limit of 5 mph will be enforced in the paddock.
- 8. Pit Out blend line violators will be dealt with by the Race Steward.
- Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Any damage to any equipment or devices utilized by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (IRDC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
- 10. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is <u>NOT</u> allowed at any time during the racing event, except in the area covered by the liquor permit issued by the Washington State Liquor Control Board. The time and location is a condition of operation of the track and enforced by track officials, ICSCC, IRDC officials or law enforcement.
- 11. No class changes after Noon on Saturday.
- 12. All Entrants shall present at tech inspection empty, sealable, container(s) marked with driver's name and car number, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquids. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from TRMP. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from TRMP.
- 13. There is to be NO Glycol or Antifreeze in ANY racecar.
- 14. There will be a \$50.00 per tire charge imposed by the track for the disposal of tires.
- Minors (under 18 years of age) must be under direct supervision of an adult at all times. No minors under 18 years of age are allowed in the hot pits or pre-grid. Operation of any type of wheeled transportation (bikes, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc.) is forbidden for anyone under the age of 16 years.
   No everyight camping at the track on Sunday night.
- 16. No overnight camping at the track on Sunday night.
- 17. There will be no refueling in the grid area unless accompanied by a fire extinguisher and operator.
- No motorized tow or support vehicles allowed on pre-grid unless authorized by the Grid Marshall or Race Chairman.
- 19. No open fires are allowed anywhere on The Ridge Motorsports Park Property.
- 20. Entrance Gate is locked at 11:00 pm Friday and Saturday nights. The gate will open by 7:00 am.
- 21. Only one support vehicle or trailer is allowed in the paddock per competition car.
- 22. The length of scheduled events may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions beyond the control of IRDC personnel.
- 23. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to this event to anyone.
- 24. Pets must be leashed at all times and owners are responsible for cleaning up animal waste.
- 25. All in-car timing system transmitter beacons must be placed with the Approval of the Race Chair in designated area. Transmitters outside of the specified area will be confiscated by the Race Chairman.
- 26. All requests for split or staggered starts must be made to the Race Steward before the end of the events on the day prior to the race.
- 27. This document is subject to change, official version will be in your packet when you register.

# The International Race Drivers Club and Car Tender

Present Round 5 of the "Northwest Mini Enduro Championship Series"

The MINI ENDURO is a one hour special feature race, run at the end of the day: Saturday, September 28<sup>th</sup> 2013.

ELIGIBILITY: Licenses – ICSCC IRR/ARR, SCCA, CACC, FIA, ASN or NASA. Other licenses subject to ICSCC License Director approval. No novice license drivers.

ENTRY FEE: \$150 USD per car. CLASSES: EO – AP, SPO, SPM, SPU, GT1, GT2, GT3, ITE, ST E1 – BP, EIP, FIP, GTL, RS, AS E2 – CP, DP, PRO3, ITS, PRO44, HIP E3 – EP, FP, SM, CSM, H4, ITA E4 – GP, HP, IP, CR, PRO7, ITB, ITC

#### <u>Mini Enduro Race Rules</u>

 MANDATORY FEATURE RACE DRIVER'S MEETING will take place immediately following the regular mandatory Saturday driver's meeting. All MINI Enduro drivers must be in attendance.

- 2. Car numbers are assigned in order of entry.
- 3. Regular ICSCC rules apply, except as noted specifically below.
- 4. Entry fee is per car.
- 5. One or two drivers per car.
- 6. Qualifying per Group 8 qualifying session, either driver may qualify the car.

7. Pit lane speed limit is 35 mph. Pit lane begins at double cones and ends at re-entry official. Pit lane speed will be strictly enforced. One crew person is allowed "over the wall" to guide the driver into the pit stall. Pit stalls assignments correlate to qualifying position.

8. There is a mandatory pit stop required between 25 and 35 minutes elapsed time. Pit stops are permitted outside of the mandatory window, but do not count towards the mandatory stop. This window and procedure may be adjusted as required depending upon total number of entries. Single driver cars The car must come to a complete stop in the pit box before a 60 second timed

hold begins or you may elect to exit the car, touch the front bumper, and re-enter the car to avoid the 60 second hold. The engine is not required to be shut off if no refueling is taking place. Once 60 seconds has elapsed, the car will be released by the timing official, however it is the driver's responsibility to leave the pit box safely in pit lane traffic.

<u>Two driver cars</u> The car is permitted to leave the pit box as quickly as the driver exchange can be completed. There is no 60 second hold for two driver cars or single cars choosing to exit, touch the front bumper and re-enter.

9. Fueling is permitted, jugs or dump cans OK, no fuel towers. Any crew member having the potential to come into contact with fuel or fuel vapors during pit stops must be attired in safety gear equal to or greater than driver gear. A dedicated crew person with fire bottle required. Driver exchange assistant and windshield cleaning is permitted while fueling. No other work permitted while fueling. No limit to number of crew, however each crew person must have a specific function. Engines must be shut off during any refueling whether single of two driver cars.
10. Pit lane will close during Full Course Caution situations. If a FCC occurs during the mandatory pit stop window, the amount of time under FCC will be added to the end of the mandatory pit stop window. Pit lane will not re-open following a FCC until the entire field has

taken the green on the restart.

11. No work of any kind is permitted under Black or Red flag situations. The race clock will continue to run.

12. Any car returning to the paddock will be considered to have withdrawn from the race and will <u>not</u> be permitted to re-enter the circuit.

13. Violation of any rule will result in a stop and go penalty assessed during green flag conditions, separate from any pit stop.

## LICENSE DIRECTOR

Man, this mid-summer break in the action feels like we just quit racing for the year. I need my novice/track fix. But wait, this weekend (as I write this) finally has a race associated with itthe Cascade Dash for Kids.

I thought it might inspire some of us to have a recap of the novice activity so far this year. Let's start with the season opener at PIR on April 27. For that first race of the year we had 26 novice closed wheel (NCW) racers start the race and 22 who finished it and got credit towards the next license level. We also had 3 novice open wheelers (NOW) start and finish.

That was a great start to the season. We had a

big batch of 8 upgrades to Area Road Racer and 2 upgrades to International Road Racer. Next came the Military Salute at Pacific Raceways, where we saw 19 NCW racers start and 17 finish along with 1 NOW racer. We also had another 3 upgrades to ARR license status. A nice follow up to the strong season opener.

Next was the double header Bruce Baggett Gran Prix at the undulating Oregon Raceway Park circuit. Here we had 18 NCW entries and one NOW entry for the first race on May 25, all of whom finished! We also had 7 more ARR upgrades and one IRR upgrade following that race. For race number 4 on May 26 we had 7 more NCW entries and 1 NOW entry. But we had 4 ARR upgrades and one IRR upgrade.

The next race was back to PIR for the Chicane Challenge. The NCW entries jumped back up to 20 of whom 19 finished for credit. We also had 2 NOW entries who took the checkered flag. Seven more ARR upgrades followed this race.



Then we all trekked to Spokane County Raceway for the Northwest Grand Prix on July 12 and 13. I hate to say this, but the novices who didn't make the trek really lost out on a great

weekend. It was unseasonably cool but actually perfect racing weather and the 3 NCW racers who braved the track on Friday and Saturday had the place to themselves. With a couple notable exceptions.
