## STEWARD'S CORNER

Only one race weekend has taken place since my last Steward message, but it was an important one. The Northwest Motorsports triple race weekend seems to be a pivotal weekend when it comes to ICSCC Championships. I have said several times in the past, "it seems the road to an ICSCC championship travels through Spokane". The last few years an extremely large percentage of the Championship winners attended the Spokane races. An example was in 2016 when ICSCC had 16 class championship winners and 13 (81\%) of those winners attended the NWMS races. It will be interesting to see how it plays out this year with the 16 -race schedule, Team Continental's double points race and SCCBC returning to their 3-day 3 race format.

The Spokane weekend had its customary several crashes and offs in the area of turns one and two. Unfortunately, two cars ended up with extreme damage and most likely will not be back on the track. The great news is all drivers did not have any serious medical issues, just the usual aches and pain. Again, this illustrates just how well our safety equipment works in keeping us safe and able to race another day.

In speaking with the drivers about their (selfinflicted) incidents the common thread in all the incidents was they happened because the drivers were not racing smart. What a perfect segway into my third installment of Smart Racing.

SMART RACING \# 3: Listen to your car and to yourself.

First, listen to your car. When your car is handling, sounding or behaving strangely don't ignore it. In a practice session, qualifying session or sprint race, stay out only as long as necessary to help identify the problem safely. Many of us have had a sudden mechanical failure on track which has caused our fellow drivers to lose track time or even race positions. This is a recognized and acceptable risk to all drivers. However, choosing to stay on track with a known mechanical problem and potentially put drivers in a situation to sustain damage to their cars is unacceptable. Definitely not Smart Racing.

Second, listen to yourself. We all have that voice in our heads that sends us warning messages. One recurring statement heard from drivers when the Stewards do investigations is "I thought I could". Notice how is wasn't "I knew I could". In these situations, I wonder if the driver was arguing with their little voice. The driver was saying I think I can and the little voice was saying I'm not so sure. Smart Racing is when you and your inner voice are in sync.

## FROM THE LICENSE DIRECTOR

As License director I am seeing requests for a conference license from many different racing venues licenses. I would like to review a common misconception with regard to passing and the responsibilities of both the passer and the person being passed. We will refer to the Conference rule $\mathrm{E} / \mathrm{C}$ 1504
E/C 1504. Responsibility in overtaking. Under all conditions, both the passed and the passing car shall be equally responsible for the safe passing of one by the other.
This rule is very crucial to Conference and is unique in that we try to have clean safe racing and this rule makes it clear that blocking and rubbing is not part of who we are.
The following is borrowed from a document explaining racing room that also refers to our rule:
I will be looking at the relationship of the car to the driver of the opposing car. If the front of the car attempting the pass reaches a line even with the driver in front before he or she turns-in, then the car in front owes racing room. My reasoning is there should be a reasonable expectation that the driver of the car in front sees the car attempting the pass to the side of him before he goes for the apex. This comes with a big "however" though. No Steward has ever been a fan of dive-bomb passes. The car attempting the pass must be under control, capable of making the corner cleanly, and not coming from multiple car-lengths behind. The attempt shouldn't be a big surprise to the car ahead. Passes that are attempted with the car out of control are Dangerous Driving and will be dealt with accordingly.
As CR 1504 states, once your car reaches the point that it's properly presented, it is now the responsibility of both drivers to avoid contact. If it's an inside move, the car in front can't turn down on you, but you also can't "run him up" to the outside of the corner either. Both cars now owe each other a car-width plus a little bit to the edge of the track. The same can be said of a pass that occurs on a straight. If the front of the car is even with the driver, both cars now owe each other room.

So when does the guy in front of you NOT owe you racing room? Again, it goes back to "presentation". If your car is not properly presented, you should not expect the driver in front of you to give you anything. No matter how close you are (or how much faster your car may be than theirs), if the person in front of you is a good racer, they most likely WILL turn for the apex, and you should expect them to do so.
All of this being said, I realize that every situation will

have nuances that need to be taken into consideration. I'm sure all of you can come up with an "Oh yeah, but what about this?" question. That's what makes the Steward's job so fun! I promise we will consider all of that if need be, but use what I've discussed here as your guide when you're making decisions out there in the heat of it

# CSCC Supplemental Regulations 2017 

## Infractions will result in penalties assessed to the driver.

1. Open to cars eligible under ICSCC current regulations.
2. This event is organized under 2017 ICSCC Competition Regulations, and all who enter PIR are subject to them. Cascade Sports Car Club reserves the right to refuse entry to this event or to PIR at any time.
3. Alcoholic beverages allowed in the beer garden area only, and only after the track closes. You may NOT bring alcohol into PIR! This is an Oregon Liquor Commission requirement. Any person caught entering PIR with alcohol will be removed from the raceway.
4. Registration Hours: 6:00 pm-8:00 Friday, 7:30 am - 1:30 pm Saturday and 7:30 am - 10:30 am Sunday.
5. Express Tech is available at Registration for those drivers who have an acceptable, current Annual Tech inspection noted in their vehicle logbook. Express Tech drivers should bring their personal safety gear or race license with a current gear tech sticker on it and vehicle logbook to Registration and a weekend tech sticker issued..
6. People under 18 years old are not allowed in hot pits, pre-grid or on victory laps. Children under 12 must have direct adult supervision at all times.
7. A current and properly completed minor release form, signed by an authorized adult, must be on record for all minor participants brought into PIR.
8. All persons in the racing "hot pit" (i.e. over the wall) shall wear shirts that cover the shoulders, and shall not wear open toe or be barefoot. Long pants are recommended.
9. The scales will be open one hour before any qualifying session or race.
10. No skateboards or scooters allowed in the paddock area. Users of bicycles and small-motorized vehicles over 16 years of age may have riding privileges revoked at any time by the Race Chairperson. 15 MPH speed limit in the paddock. NO ONE UNDER 16 is allowed.
11. Refueling is not allowed in pre-grid. Fueling in the hot pits requires a crewmember assigned only to operate a fire bottle. Excess spillage will result in a penalty.
12. No smoking allowed in hot pits, pre-grid or any PIR building.
13. Only one support vehicle allowed in the paddock. Pit and pre-grid roads must remain clear.
14. Noise rule ICSCC 1112 enforced! 103.0 dB at $50 \mathrm{ft} .: ~ n o ~ e x c e p t i o n s!~$
15. Oregon State Law requires functioning mufflers to be used at PIR. Functioning mufflers must be capable of reducing sound energy by at least 5 dB at trackside. Cars losing mufflers, even if they are still below the sound level, will be black-flagged immediately.
16. Damage to the track, grounds or buildings, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Also, damage to any equipment or devices used by the sanctioning body (ICSCC) or sponsoring club (CSCC) to conduct this race, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible.
17. Family and crewmembers of drivers are to contact the landline communication person at pre-grid with any questions regarding their driver or car while on track.
18. All entrants for this event should have a sealable container or containers, capable of holding 2 gallons of liquid. These are to be used to remove all oil, cleaners, brake fluid, etc. from PIR. There will be no drums provided.
19. Anyone caught dumping oil at the raceway will be fined and banned from the raceway. This is a PIR regulation.
20. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular event, drivers and cars entered as an "additional event" will be restricted from participating, on a first-come, first-served priority based on the date entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by all drivers for whom the event is their primary event, including Novices upgrading to a championship event.
21. NSF checks will be charged an additional $\$ 50$ fee.
22. The racing "hot pit" is defined as that area under the control of Hot Pits personnel. This area is located immediately west of the break in the concrete wall half way up the pit lane. At the one-minute warning pre-grid must be cleared of all crew, support personnel and spectators. Notwithstanding the above, ICSCC rule \#1607 does not apply to the pre-grid area.
23. All cars that are towed into the paddock area are subject to being dropped off in impound. Drivers must wear all required drivers safety equipment (per ICSCC rule \# 1105) before they are allowed to enter the track, while they are on the track, beyond positive protection, under flat tow, or in the hot pits area.
24. The 5 -minute warning will be given approximately 8 minutes before the start of the race.
25. Due to recent incidents, extension cords from the pit exit to tech/scales must use a more secure method at all times.
26. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
27. Blend line- the Red Blend line stays on drivers left as you enter the racetrack from the pit area. You are required to stay on the right side until the Red Blend line ends. This is REQUIRED EVERY TIME you enter the Race Track, other than the race out lap.
The Red Blend line stays on the drivers left at the end of the Turn 12 tire wall. If you are to exit the race track at anytime, you are required to stay completely to the right. If you cross the blend line with ONE TIRE you are required to stay out for one more lap unless you are exiting the track after you have received the checkered flag and crossed the start/finish line.
28. Speed Limit 35 mph from the bridge to pit out.
29. MOVE IN RULES FOR PIR AS FOLLOWS: NO VEHICLES ARE ALLOWED IN PIT AREA ON THURSDAY AT ANY TIME. IF YOU REQUEST AN EARLY MOVEIN PRIOR TO 6AM FRIDAY CONTACT GARY BOCKMAN 503 209-6349.
30. The area to the north of the Pro Tower is reserved parking for ICSCC and CSCC officials.
31. Drivers are responsible AT ALL TIMES of their crew members and guests.

## SCCBC 2017 Event Supplementary Regulations for ICSCC

Your application/entry to the event constitutes acceptance of these Supplementary Regulations. Infractions will result in penalties being assessed to the driver.

1. All events are to be held on the Mission Raceway Park Road Course in a counter clockwise direction.
2. All events will be timed \& scored by the AMB Transponder System. Race cars must have an AMB TranX260 transponder installed and operating in each session.
3. Open to cars eligible under ICSCC, ASN Canada FIA, CACC, or SCCA current regulations.
4. Insurance shall be as per icSCC regulations.
5. Drivers must present a valid driver's license as well as a valid racing license issued by iCSCC, asn Canada Fia (All Regions), SCCA, or NASA. Licenses of other sanctioning bodies may be honored at the discretion of the License director.
6. All Competitors, entrants, Crewmembers and guests must sign the official release agreement and waiver.
7. Minors ( 12 to 18) registered as crew or volunteer must have a parent sign an Annual Parental Waiver. No one under the age of 19 is permitted in the hot pit area. Drivers must be 18 years of age or fall under ICSCC Competition Regulation 613. D.
8. NSF cheques will be charged an additional $\$ 40.00$ Canadian fee.
9. Competitors affected by a race cancellation will be notified by telephone, if possible, or by first class letter.
10. Consumption of alcohol during an event is not PERMITTED at Mission Raceway Park! You are responsible for the behavior of your crew and guests.
11. Registration \& Tech hours and procedures for handling Late Entries as per the race announcement.
12. Driver Services and the Official Notice Board are located in the SCCBC Clubhouse near Pregrid.
13. Prior to 10 minutes before the 1 st scheduled session each day, race engines may only be idled to warm, or to report to tech and return to their paddock space.
14. The scales will be open at 7:30AM SATURDAY, SUNDAY \& MONDAY
15. No skateboards, scooters, or roller blades. NO ONE UNDER 16 IS ALLOWED TO OPERATE A MOTORIZED VEHICLE!
16. Both front paved lanes in the Paddock area run EASTBOUND. Rear lane is two way. Speed Limit: 8 kph ( 5 mph ) - excessive speed will be subject to penalties assessed by the Steward. No testing on any facility roadway.
17. Refueling not allowed in Pregrid. Fueling in the Hot Pits requires a crewmember assigned only to manning a fire bottle.
18. NO SMOKing allowed in Hot Pits, Pregrid, or any Mission Raceway Park Building.
19. The Hot Pit speed limit is fifty (50) kilometers per hour ( 30 mph ). The Hot Pit Lane ends at the Starters Tower.
20. Entrants may only park support vehicles within their own paddock space. Roads MUST remain clear. No parking on the north side of the NORTH PADDOCK ROADWAY.
21. No generators may exceed 80 decibels (db) from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM. No generators from 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM. No one may plug into any FACILITY POWER OUTLET.
22. No race vehicle may exceed 100 decibels (db) measured at 50ft. from the racing surface. Readings will be taken at an acceleration point. Cars exceeding the db limit will be meatballed and must affect a repair prior to re-entering the track.
23. Damage to track, grounds, buildings or equipment, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Damage to paved areas may result in fines. You are required to protect the asphalt from damage by jacks, jack stands, poles, etc.
24. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular group, drivers and cars entered as an "additional entry" will be restricted from participating, based on the date the entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by those for whom the EVENT IS THEIR PRIMARY EVENT, INCLUDING NOVICES UPGRADING TO A CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT.
25. All hazardous waste spills are to be reported to the Paddock Marshal. Anyone caught dumping oil will be Fined and BanNed from the raceway. Drivers will be assessed a cost of $\$ 50$ per bag for any grease sweep required for fluid leaks or spills anywhere in the facility.
26. DO NOT BLOCK THE PAVED PADDOCK LANES DURING RACES.
27. No open fires anywhere! barbecues will be the only exception as long as they are away from any combustible source such as gas cans, gas tanks or fuel cells, etc.
28. No overnight camping at the track Monday night without permission, please contact the SCCBC President.
29. Gates are closed for the evening at 10:30pm and reopened at 7:00am.
30. Visible wristbands must be worn and clearly visible in the Pregrid, Hot Pits and Impound areas.
31. All pets must be restrained as per ICSCC Race Regulation 1603C.
32. Upon exiting the Hot Pit, stay in the dedicated pit-out lane to turn 1. Failure to comply may result in penalty or exclusion
33. Any race vehicle on the run off road drivers right turn four must come to a stop prior to Turn Station 6 and wait for direction from a Corner Worker prior to re-entering the track. No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may RESULT IN A PENALTY.
34. Race cars failing to negotiate Turn 1 that do not pass the Commitment Line may re-enter safely at Turn 1 . Any race car past the Commitment Line must re-enter safely at Turn 3. No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may result in penalty at the discretion of the Steward.
35. Any race vehicle that exits the racing surface in 7A or 7B must re-enter the track only when safe to do so. . No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
36. Vehicles exiting the track via the pit entrance must stay four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line in Turn 9 for the entire length of the white line. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
37. Vehicles not exiting the track must not place four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line in turn 9.
38. The SCCBC reserves the right to, at their discretion, refuse entry and/or access and/or remove participants from the Mission Raceway Park.
39. There is no access to Race Control without the permission of Race Control.
40. There is no access to the PA stand except for authorized observers and event personnel.
41. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
42. The 5 -minute warning will be given no earlier than 8 minutes before the scheduled race start

NWMS Supplemental Regulations

## 2017 Mini Enduro Round 9

1. All 2017 Northwest Mini Enduro rules apply including car classification with the addition to the following supplemental rules:
a. Qualifying
b. 10 minute qualifying session to set the field.
c. One or both drivers may drive the car during the session with the fastest time set by either driver being used as their qualifying time.
d. Grid shall be set fastest to slowest.
2. Race - A mandatory pit stop shall be made between the 20 and 40 minute mark of the race. The mandatory pit stop will be 60 seconds regardless of driver change/no driver change.
3. Mission Pit Stop/Pit Lane Rules
a. Pit lane speed limit $50 \mathrm{kph}(30 \mathrm{mph})$
b. While on pit lane, use far left lane except to enter and exit pit stall.
c. Pit stalls will be assigned by qualifying position.
d. One crew member is allowed over the wall to signal the car into its pit stall.
e. During a full course yellow, pit lane will be closed. If you are in pit lane at the time of a full course yellow, you will be released to join rejoin the field. If a full course yellow or a black/red flag occurs during the mandatory pit stop window, the amount of time under the full course yellow or black/red flag will be added to the end of the window time. Pit lane will not re-open until the entire field has passed start/finish after the restart of the race. No work of any kind is allowed under a black/red flag. The clock will continue to run.
4. Minimum penalties: Pit lane speed violation, fuel spillage over 4" diameter - Stop and go. Pit stop window violation -2 minute penalty.
5. Trophies: One or two in class - 1st only; three to five in class - 1st and 2nd only; six or more in class - 1st, 2nd, and 3d.
6. MANDATORY DRIVERS MEETING: See schedule. Failure to attend will result in starting at the end of the field.
