# FROM THE PRESIDENT

ello to my extended Conference family of Racers, Volunteers, and Participants!

Looks like my retirement from Club and Conference responsibility so I can concentrate on being a marginally skilled aging race driver is on hold again. ICSCC was the grassroots portal that allowed me an opportunity to live out my lifelong dream of racing a sports car. Along the way I have had some of the best experiences of my life and made so many great friends and met people that I admire and look up to. Several of those that I respect most suggested that Conference was in further need of my services so I agreed, somewhat reluctantly, to answer that call. When I say reluctantly it isn't because I am afraid of the work or the responsibility. It's because we are at a difficult point in our history that is going to require some hard decisions to protect this great legacy and I don't want to fail you.

Conference is facing declining entries, increasing costs, and strong competition for new drivers. Statistics show that young people today are less affluent, less interested in cars and driving, have a wider range of hobby options, and favor shorter and less frequent "events" and "experiences" over season long campaigns. When I was a child if someone asked me what I wanted to be when I grew up it was even money on race car driver, astronaut, or baseball player but it seems like those answers have become significantly less popular as time has passed. That doesn't mean those kids don't still exist. They are just a smaller percentage of the whole which means we need to try even harder to make sure we reach them. I fervently believe that the ICSCC is still a great organization that can serve the dreams of many more years of hopeful drivers so I want us to be there for the people racing now and those who are dreaming of racing with us in the future.

The next few years are going to require some critical and potentially controversial decisions to stop the trend of decreasing race attendance and lack of attention to strengthening an aging driver and volunteer base. We are lucky to still be the largest and most successful traditional sports car racing organization in the Northwest but our challenges are coming from what I consider three major areas. First is budget endurance racing which is primarily responsible for draining away the drivers that used to feed our whole system and typically raced in Group 2. Second is the interest in Vintage racing which attracts people to the kinds of cars that they remember their heroes driving but are sometimes less competitive and more averse to damage. Third is ... everything else. That includes social media, television, hiking, video and computer games, etc. Starting in my next Memo submission I will try to expand on these thoughts and possible solutions but I challenge everyone who cares enough to read this to think hard about where, or even if, they want to see Conference in the years to come. I am eager to get your ideas and feedback. I admit that I was one of those who thought that we would see a return to better attendance numbers as the economy got back up to speed but I can assure that has not happened. The time for waiting and hoping that things will correct themselves has passed. It is clear we need to condense our weekends and schedule, find ways to include and encourage participants we are not currently reaching, all while not alienating the core group of loyal members we have served for years. We have a lot of work to do, so I hope I can count on your help because I am going to need it!

## FROM THE LICENSE DIRECTOR

verall, this year was on par with last in regards to novice participation. We averaged slightly less entries per race than 2017 at 8.3 (down from roughly 10). Total entry count was 83 (breakdown by race and club below). However, we upgraded roughly the same number of drivers. 20 novices and 8 observation drivers upgraded (vs 18 and 6 last year) over the course of the year. The drop in the average was primarily due to a last-minute decision in Spokane to open up Sunday to our novice drivers.

We expanded the practice of combining novices with the senior race groups when it made sense this year. We combined the novices at three race weekends - Spokane, Dash for Kids at PIR, and at the season finale at The Ridge. While this practice makes it a bit more difficult to find convenient times for all novices to meet; overall I believe it still provides value to the clubs by allowing them greater flexibility.

Another successful endeavor this year was the participation of senior drivers in the Novice races. We tried this twice early in the year and it was very effective. The Novice drivers learned a lot and enjoyed the coaching they received. The Senior drivers that participated also seemed to enjoy the

experience. Overall this appears to be a more effective form of observation than having senior drivers watch from the grandstands. I'd like to expand including seniors with the Novices next year.

We tried a new program once this year at PIR to motivate senior drivers to observe the novice race. The "Golden Ticket" program enticed a few folks to volunteer that might not have normally, but it did not generate the level of excitement I was hoping for. I'm inclined to try it again next year to see if the results are different.

## FROM THE LICENSE REGISTRAR

appy Holidays everyone! I hope you are enjoying your off-season with family and friends.

Here are just a few quick reminders and new licensing notes for 2019...

- 1. Your <u>2018 ICSCC</u> Competition License expires <u>12-31-18</u>. If you are planning to compete in a race before our season officially begins, you should get your application in early. The 2019 race schedule will be finalized in January, but the tentative schedule is on the ICSCC website now.
- 2. All the <u>2019 forms</u> (License Application, Medical History, and Physical Exam) have been updated and can be downloaded from the ICSCC website. Please check your <u>2018 license for your 4-digit driver identification number and medical expiration date.</u> And don't forget to <u>use the checklist</u> at the bottom of the license application form to ensure your application will be received as complete.
- 3. For 2019, all <u>ICSCC Competition License</u> fees must be paid on motorsportreg. This year you will have the option of purchasing a 1-year or 2-year license (if eligible). To be eligible for a 2-year license, your medical must expire 12-31-20 or later. Drivers who will be 69 and older in 2019 are not eligible for the 2-year license option. The license fee is \$90 for 1-year or \$180 for 2-years. Expedite fees for late applications will remain at \$75. Both U.S. and Canadian credit cards are accepted.

To pay on motorsportreg:
Go to the motorsportreg home page
In the "Find Events" box, type ICSCC and hit search
"Competition License Fee" should pop up
Continue as requested
It would be a good idea to print and keep a copy of your
paid receipt.

4. This year you will also have the option of purchasing a 1-year or 2-year club membership to go along with your 1-year or 2-year license. All ICSCC Club Membership cards must expire no earlier than November 30, 2019/2020. You will still need to send a

copy of your club card, a motorsportreg receipt, or email verification from your club to obtain a license. Renew early. The processing of your license application is much faster if you send all your documents at the same time.

5. Pictures are no longer required and will not appear on your license in 2019.

And finally, after 5 years as your ICSCC License Registrar I am passing the baton to another Linda. Your new license registrar for 2019 is Linda Bostrom. Many of you already know her - I know she will take good care of you.

I think that's it for now, but feel free to email or call if you have additional questions. It has been a pleasure getting to meet and work with all the new and returning drivers each year. I am looking forward to the upcoming year of racing.

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














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
