### FROM THE PRESIDENT

**T**he 2109 ICSCC Championship Racing Season which was already speeding past has suddenly crossed the finish line in spectacular fashion and is proceeding back to paddock waiving thanks to our hard-working volunteers. A very small number of critically essential volunteers work feverishly to make sure events can be held, clubs continue to operate, and Conference remains in existence. In most cases those people have jobs, families, lives, and responsibilities and are wedging their service to the racing community into their “spare” (chuckle) time. Those people, myself included, can sometimes be so focused on fixing problems and worrying about the future that it seems like most of what is said in print and in person comes across as “nagging” or “doom and gloom”. In a previous memo I took time to concentrate on some of the positive things that are happening in Conference and was surprised at the supportive responses I received. It reminded me of how tiny a percentage of people EVER get the opportunity to be involved in any significant level of racing and of how much I enjoy the relationships I have with the people that I have met in the sport. In that spirit I intend to try to present a more balanced commentary because there is still plenty to be positive about!

**Positive:** Thanks to IRDC for proactively making a move intended to get the final Championship race of the year out of the beginning of the rainy season and into the end of the Summer. The race was very well attended with lots of great racing and championships decided. Nice job IRDC!

**Negative:** Far too many cars were heavily damaged or destroyed this year. I don't want Conference racing to become a “race car parade” but I conversely do not want us to drive with the aggression of teen professional hopefuls in low level formula car racing. Look out for each other!

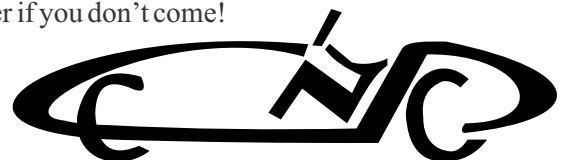
**Positive:** The drivers of Conference have given me my pre-season wish – after years of slow decline the numbers are saying we had slightly more entries for 2019 than 2018. There is still much to be done but I am happy to celebrate a year where total entries did not shrink!

**Negative:** Every single member club except one had less entries at its events in 2019 than 2018. Luckily the one club that was the exception had enough of an increase in entries over 2018 to offset the decrease in all other clubs combined. See positive #1 above!

**Positive:** Thanks to Pro3 (285 entries), CT4/EIP (182 entries), Spec Miata (155 entries), and GT1/2 (97 entries). Note that I have combined CT4/EIP and GT1/2 because they are mostly cars that are just as legal for either class and are currently using some random logic as to which class to run. These four groups comprise 45.7% of the total entries for the year and have spectacular door to door racing that is fantastic to watch. Honorable mention to SE46 (68 entries) who usually also enter SPM (65 entries).

**Negative:** Nobody is reading the Competition Regulations, Policy and Procedure Manual, or the Supplemental Race Regulations. It is always shocking that people who have the knowledge and experience to get a race car to the track will be OUTRAGED when our officials enforce rules they didn't even realize existed. It is your responsibility to understand the rules. If you don't like them, you have the power to change them. If you don't change them be prepared to adhere to them. We always want to be inclusive but there must be some structure.

Lastly - two important racing events remain on the 2019 calendar. On October 5<sup>th</sup> Team Continental is holding it's second Track Trials event at Oregon Raceway Park. It's a fun one day event that you can drive a street car to so if you missed driving ORP the last couple years this is a great opportunity to support TC and have some fun before the season closes out. October 19<sup>th</sup> is the legendary Cascade Enduro which has 2-hour, 4-hour, and 8 hour races available to fit your car and effort level. Everyone says they love Endurance races – here is your chance to support one. Clubs can't continue to provide these opportunities forever if you don't come!





## STEWARD'S CORNER

There is now just one race weekend left in the 2019 race season and is at The Ridge. I hope everyone that is able to will be able to make the final races of the year or if not will try to get a car together to run the Cascade Enduro later in October.

This is the time of year where we need to think about candidates for driver of the year. I am taking nominations for the 2019 Driver of the year so if you have a good candidate that qualifies in driving ability and contribution to Conference than let me know. We are also looking for someone to take on the job of Assistant Race steward for 2020 to assist Duane and then be Steward for 2021. Dwayne and I received a protest from Car #12 GTL against car #52 GTL in Grp 5 regarding his Inlet Restrictor. I followed # 52 to his pit after his race and presented the protest to him and asked to see his restrictor. He claimed that I had no accurate way to measure it and would not lift his hood to show me the restrictor. For his class he is required to run a 24 MM inlet restrictor We went back and forth on our ability to measure his restrictor and finally came to the conclusion that he was not going to present his restrictor for verification and we were asked to leave. Conference rules state that we are allowed to inspect cars for legality in class and since he refused the inspection we have imposed a 1 race suspension and at the next Conference race he shows up to will need to show he is compliant with his class rules.

## ENDURO CORNER *by Chris Heinrich*

Only one weekend and technically two races remain in the Northwest Mini Enduro Championship Series (NWMECS) for 2019. The 2 hour finale is a little over a month away on October 19<sup>th</sup> in Portland. Remember that the 2 hour finale counts as two races but single points.

Drivers with two races can qualify for the championship by racing in the 2 hour to bring their total number of races up to the four race minimum needed. Don't forget that only your best six races count for the championship so if you have a bad race or two you can substitute the results from the 2 hour for up to two bad results. With so many different scenarios the championship has yet to be decided in four of the five classes!

The Contenders: In MSR, Grimsrud holds a 6 point lead over Forsyth with third place Snyder still in the hunt. In ME0, Lowe has a slim one point lead over Brown, a three point lead over Hudson, and an eight point lead over last year's ME0 champion Levine. ME1 sees no one catching multiple NWMECS champ Hurley as he has a lock on the championship. Another extremely close battle is in ME2 where any of three drivers - Hovington, McAffer, or Bercovitz could win this one! Hovington is going for back to back championships in this hotly contested class. In ME3 the championship is between Keenan, Dunning, and Smalley. To recap, four of the five classes have at least three drivers who can win the championship. Stay tuned for the next Enduro Corner to see who came away with the 2019 NWMECS honors.

As most already know, the 2 hour NWMECS finale is part of Cascade's Festival of Endurance. In addition to the 2 hour race there's a 4 hour race and an 8 hour race. Last year Cascade went a

different direction with their year end enduro by trying a couple of firsts - a chicane event and an 8 hour race that finished in the daylight. For 2019 they are going back to the traditional non-chicane race and the 8 hour will once again finish in the dark! Things that are staying the same are: A track crossing that allows 2 and 4 hour participants to leave well before the 8 hour race finishes, an early entry discount, and a tow allowance for teams towing from outside of OR/WA. Get those teams put together for a 2 hour, 4 hour, or 8 hour race or do what a lot of teams do and enter all three! It's been said before but the off season in the Pacific Northwest is way too long. Here's your chance to get the car out one more time this year!

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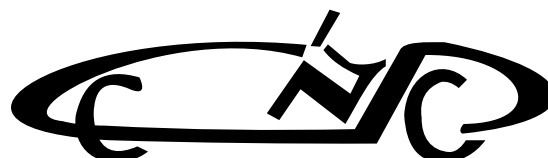

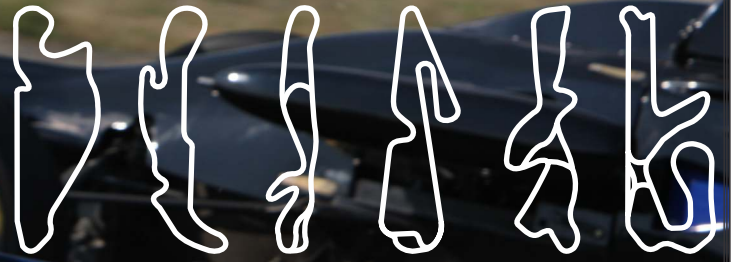
