FROM THE PRESIDENT

ello all! As always seems to be the case, we wait impatiently through what seems like an Lunbearably long winter only to find most of the summer has rushed by almost before we notice that it has arrived. In addition, for well over a year we have had a sizable number of voluntary and/or involuntary restrictions and limitations placed upon our normal activities that seem to have pushed a lot of people out of their regular routines. My experience suggests this often results in people having to think about things they normally do almost automatically. Whether driver or volunteer most of us have not gotten the regular repetitions that keep us sharp, trained, and "unconsciously competent". As the year goes on I am certain that everyone that has re-engaged will start gaining those valuable repetitions and finding their way back to higher levels of proficiency as the rust wears off.

While we are on the subject, I would be interested in some anecdotal info from those of you who haven't found your way back out to the racetrack this year if you are willing to share. Are you still reluctant to come back because of lingering concerns about health or age factors that make you more susceptible to Covid issues? Are you affected by the possibility of rain or heat that you are not willing to deal with? Have parts or materials availability affected your ability to have your car ready? Maybe just being out of your rhythm has affected your preparation or motivation? Do family obligations, Mothers Day, or Father's Day affect your decisions to attend? Is the inflated price of nearly everything hampering your budget? Are there some tracks that pull you in and some that don't entice you as much? Does your home country's closed border or 14 day quarantine affect your attendance? (OK, that one is meant as a joke. We definitely miss our northern cousins and know you would be here if you could!) Those of us who volunteer to keep Conference running are always trying to determine what factors are critical to attendance so please feel free to drop me a line at president@icscc.com if you have some info to share or a story to tell. It was a beautiful sunny weekend at Portland International about a week ago and there is no sugar coating it – I was disappointed at the

attendance. There was an OK turnout for the event but I really thought that paddock should have been packed considering there was excellent weather, folks had plenty of time to get their licenses and prepare their cars if they missed the openers, and I anticipated more pent up excitement for this season considering how little was available last year.

For those who recognize how much fun it is to run for Conference Championships, I ran through what it would take to win the big trophy for your class and a nice little patch for your driving suit in Memo #2. Since Northwest Motorsports was forced to cancel the Spokane County Raceway event because of the track not being available to anyone, it has changed the math slightly just as I warned that it could. We are still scheduled to have 14 races (6 CSCC, 6 IRDC, 2 SCCBC) so you now need to participate in 7 to qualify for a championship and you need to complete half of the laps to be scored as a finisher in half of those races(rounded down) which is 3. The Canadian government is starting to sound like they might finally be opening the border soon and if they do that last Conference event with Sports Car Club of BC September 4&5 will be the path to an ICSCC Championship. If you are chasing a championship or just want to go have some good fun, plan to attend their race.

On the subject of Conference Championship Points - Duane Martinsen, who has already given lots of time to Conference in other positions, volunteered to be Conference Points keeper this year. I became aware of an unsung volunteer who has invested substantial time and effort into creating the points reporting system on the Conference website. Past Points keeper Zack George has been working with Duane to get him up to speed on collecting the required data which he supplies to Rod Davison (another hard working SCCBC volunteer!) who has a process for calculating and displaying those points. Belated thanks Ron for your efforts on creating this format and keeping it running currently.

I suggest reading the rule and making any necessary upgrades that you might required.

irst of all, again I want to express my deep deep thanks to all of those members of Conference who have stepped forward and lent a hand to make my life easier. Also, every one of us needs to thank the officers who make this organization run; the insane amount of work put out by your fellow volunteers right up to and throughout a race week ends, astounding.

The 2021 Novice licensing program has seen a lot of interest and activity. All three of the race weekends so far have had a robust attendance in the novice and observation ranks. The second Portland race had 13 novices registered! This is both a great challenge and opportunity. So far on balance I am going to say we have had success.

After race 1 in Portland, every subsequent race has been run without a Group 7. Most of us understand this is the legacy of dwindling novice counts in years past. If trends continue (and IRDC is holding a competition school before the July race), there will continue to be plenty of novice drivers ready to complete their driving portion of the licensing showing up. So expect to see orange squares and squares with Xs for a while yet.

This means I need to place novice drivers within the Senior groups that are running Championship races. What's the best way to do this? I understand my first pass at this wasn't received with universal acclaim, and I got to hear feedback about it. So, what do we do? We adjust.

On a case by case, race by race and day by day basis, I am doing my best to place the drivers in the right groups, and then also where in the grid they get to line up. Welcome to multi-class racing folks! In Portland race 6, I had the novice gridded where they qualified, and there was some legit racing going on. Feedback from both senior drivers

and novices after the races was almost universally positive, so good job all around. Senior driver feedback, counsel and guidance is always welcome.

Last thoughts, launching from that notion; without the ability to control the novices and observe them in the way a dedicated Group 7 allows, senior driver feedback is more important than ever. I heartily implore all of us to seek out the novice drivers who ran in our groups and provide constructive feedback. Join me in continuing to welcome the newest members of the racing fraternity. Looking forward to seeing you all at the races!







ENDURO CORNER

he 2021 Northwest Mini Enduro Championship Series (NWMECS) is nearing the halfway point. With the cancellation of Spokane there have been some modifications to the number of races needed to qualify for the championship and the total number of races that count for the championship. The good news is that if you haven't raced in any NWMECS races so far this year you still have time to compete in enough races to qualify for the championship and still race in the maximum number of races that count for the championship! Four races are needed to qualify for the championship with a driver's best five finishes counting for championship points. The remaining races are at Pacific Raceways in July, Portland and the Ridge in August, and the two hour at Portland in October which counts as two races.

The Contenders: In MSR, Grimsrud and Greco are tied a top the standings with Forsyth in the hunt 10 points back. The ME0 class battle has Krause and Wikstrom tied for first. Asselin has a commanding lead in ME1 and in ME2 McAffer is 18 points up on Weller. The third place battle in ME2 is where things get tight. There are seven drivers within 6 points of each other! In ME3 Anderson is up 6 over

Connelly. The championship is far from over with just under half the season complete. Now is the time to jump in and make a run for the NWMECS championship.

The ICSCC race season officially ends October 16th at Cascade's Festival of Endurance. The 2, 4, and 8 hour races (all combined in one) is a great way to cap off the year! ICSCC's Enduro License gives experienced racers an avenue to be able to race endurance races with ICSCC. Whether you're a previously licensed driver or a driver who comes from the budget racing scene, there is a good chance you qualify for the ICSCC Enduro License. For only \$25 drivers with racing experience can be part of a team.

The race remains relatively unchanged from 2020 – LeMans start, finishing in the dark, and if the 8 hour has at least 25 entries prize money of up to \$1750 per class will be paid out! There is one addition this year and that is a new "Street Tire" class for cars racing on slightly harder (low wear) tires. This class replaces the undersubscribed E4 class.

For the past several years Retro Racing has been the Gold sponsor of the event and are continuing to do so in 2021! Thank you Retro Racing for all the years of support. They claim the best thank you would be to see a full paddock of race cars at the event!

2021 is still full of opportunities to race. Hope to see you at a race soon!



Entries with a 2021 Annual Tech sticker on your logbook can complete your race tech form at registration and receive your weekend tech sticker then and there and be good to go. Drivers without 2021 Annuals must have your car and apparel inspected by an authorized tech official. Tech officials will be roaming Friday evening, or bring your car and gear to the scale station area for inspection.

International Race Drivers Club Supplemental Regulations - The Ridge Motorsport Park

- 1. The event is open to race cars meeting current year ICSCC competition regulations.
- 2. The event is organized according to current year ICSCC competition regulations. All persons entering the event and/or TRMS property are subject to current year ICSCC competition regulations.
- 3. All persons entering TRMS property must sign in on the event waiver document at the main gate and wear the provided wristband on their wrist at all times. An additional minor release form is required for all persons under 18 years old. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person for any reason without explanation.
- 4. Minors must be under the direct supervision of a responsible adult at all times. Minors are not permitted at any time in any "hot" area.
- 5. Persons under 12 years old may not use any kind of wheeled transportation on TRMS property, including but not limited to bicycles, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc...
- 6. The paddock area entrance road gates may be locked between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00am.
- 7. There is no parking permitted along the paddock entrance road, or along the fence line at the north edge of the paddock. This is a defined fire lane, any vehicles parked there will be immediately towed with no notice.
- 8. 5 mph speed limit in the paddock. This will be strictly enforced.
- 9. Pets are welcome but must be leashed at all times and please clean up after your animal.
- 10. One support vehicle **OR** trailer per race car in the paddock.
- 11. Authorized vehicles only on the race course at any time. No motorized vehicles of any kind permitted at any time on the race course without permission or authorization from ICSCC officials.
- 12. No race car engines running before 8:00am or after 7:00 pm. Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. Please respect and be considerate of the neighbors to preserve our future ability to hold events at TRMS.
- 13. ICSCC event noise rule 1112 is in effect at all times. 103.0 dB @ 50 feet. No exceptions.
- 14. Positively no dumping of oil or other hazardous substances on TRMS property. Anyone doing so will be charged with all mitigation costs, could possibly be criminally charged, and will absolutely be permanently banned from all IRDC events.
- 15. Any damage to TRMS property and or facilities, including but not limited to the track, barriers, fencing, buildings, etc..., regardless of cause, whether accidental or intentional, will be billed to the responsible person. Likewise, any damage to equipment or devices provided by ICSCC or IRDC regardless of cause will also be billed to the responsible person.
- 16. No open fires permitted.
- 17. No motorized tow or support vehicles are permitted on pre-grid, unless specifically authorized in advance by the Grid Marshall or Race Chairman.
- 18. No refueling on the grid without a dedicated person at the ready with a suitable fire extinguisher.
- 19. Pit Exit blend line is in effect. Violations are subject to penalty.
- 20. The race schedule may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions.
- 21. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted at any time during the racing event and governed by permit conditions during the times when racing events are concluded.
- 22. No race class changes after 1:00 pm on Saturday afternoon.
- 23. The authorized location for timing beacons/devices are beyond start finish on the wall. No other locations are permitted; timing equipment placed outside of the authorized area will be confiscated.
- 24. Requests for split or staggered starts for championship points events must be submitted to the Race Steward by 5:00 pm Saturday.
- 25. Overnight camping on TRMS property Sunday night requires permission from track management.
- 26. TRMS will not be providing power to drivers or crew. You will need to provide your own power if needed.
- 27. Exit to paddock, do not exceed paddock speed of 5 mph. If returning to race and race damage was repaired, you must be checked by tech and log book signed. Proceed to pre-grid, do not exceed paddock speed of 5 mph. Before returning to race you must be cleared by pre-grid and waved back to track. Do not exceed pre-grid speed of 5 mph until you clear Start/Finish. Any violation of paddock/pre-grid speed will be severely addressed.
