



BORDER CHALLENGE 300 RULES

What is the "BORDER CHALLENGE 300"?

Answer: The BORDER CHALLENGE 300 is a 300 mile race which equates to 156 laps around PIR w/out the chicane. All cars entered in the race actually race until they have completed 156 laps (within 8 hours). The order in which 156 laps are completed will determine the finishing order of the race.

This race also encompasses a friendly competition between Oregon, Washington, and Canada. In this competition, each team declares which Border region best represents their team. If a team feels that they do not represent any of these regions, they will be placed in the region that has the lowest participation. With a possible eight classes in the competition (E0, E1, E2, E3, E4, EUO, EUU, & ESR), the Border region that wins the most classes is the Border Challenge Champion. If a tie results, the tie breaker will be awarded to the team (region) that completed 156 laps first between the tying regions. Special prizes & an especially cool trophy will be awarded!!!

HIGHLIGHTS: Lemans starting procedure

Race should be able to be completed in the daylight – 3 ½ - 4 ½ hours for most cars

No minimum driver requirement (at least 1)!!

Rules follow the 8 Hours of the Cascades
