I realize that the Annual Banquet is months away but it is time to start thinking about nominees for Driver of the Year. Find your Competition Committee Representative and submit your choice.



STEWARD'S SOAP BOX

As I write this month's article we have just finished race #7, only 4 weekends left in the championship season. Wow, it is going by fast and it has been a very good year to be Steward (knock on wood). We are averaging about ½ the number of violations as last year for flag violations and avoidable contact. Unfortunately I fear it is due to the small grid sizes. The larger the grids, the more violations. You're thinking "duh", but it is not linear. 100 entries no incidents, 200 and we have a busy weekend. Which means that if you are out in a large grid of cars you must pay even closer attention to the flag stations.

I would like to talk about passing or "overtaking" as defined in our rules and insights into how this Steward decides who is most at fault. I was going to write about this early in my Stewarding but everything was going so good

Rule E/C 1504. *Responsibility in overtaking.* Under all conditions, both the passed and the passing car shall be equally responsible for the safe passing of one by the other.

If there is an incident in an overtaking situation, the first thing we do is try to assess if the car initiating the pass was performing a "dive bomb" as this clearly would not be a safe action. It is easier to describe what is not a "dive bomb". (I borrowed this from a past Steward's Corner by Tom Olsen.) The car attempting the pass must be under control, capable of making the corner cleanly, and not coming from multiple car-lengths behind. The attempt shouldn't be a big surprise to the car ahead; this is a key later on too.

The more complicated situation (to assess blame) is when there is close racing and the lead car leaves the door open entering a corner. There are two rules of thumb that have gotten several drivers in trouble. First: the lead car owns the corner unless the passing car can get its bumper to his door pillar (or something like that). The same article I borrowed the above quote from also lays out a "b-pillar" standard for when rule 1504 is in play and it is true that if the passing car is along side and it was not a "dive bomb" then it should have been clear there was a pass being attempted and rule 1504 is

in play. But this does not mean that if the passing car is not up to your door that it is OK to head to the apex cutting off the passing driver. There is no "b-pillar" standard in our Competition Regulations and I think for good reason. We don't want drivers turning down on cars just because they didn't make it up to their door nor do we want passing cars to come in just a little faster than prudent in order to make it to the door of the lead car. We look to see if the lead car knows or should have known there was a pass attempt in progress.

Second: if you are the car being passed, your "responsibility" is to leave one car width plus 6 inches. I could not find any reference to "racing room" in our Competition Regulations but 1 car width plus 6 inches is rarely sufficient "racing room" in a turn. In long sweeping corners (like T2 at PR or T4 at PIR or T2 at SCR) this might be OK, but in almost all others it is likely not and could result in avoidable contact with the passee at the fault. When there is contact, we look to see how much room there was on each side of the cars involved. If one car has tires on the edge of the track (or off) and the other had half a track to spare, we will generally find against the driver with room left to give.

In a close race, the best thing is take a defensive line and not leave the door open to a pass attempt, but if you find yourself in a passing situation, remember you will rarely be at fault if there is contact if you were leaving as much room as possible.

The folks I have the most fun racing with are the ones I know will leave me adequate "racing room" and they know the same about me.

ENDURO CORNER

The “ENDURO CORNER” is a monthly message updating and informing racers on endurance racing activities for 2014.

With five of nine races in the books, the **NORTHWEST MINI ENDURO CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES (NWMECS)** is now over halfway through the season. With only the best six point finishes counting, it's still anyone's championship!!

Last month we focused on the **Border Challenge 300** and the “Challenge” or “Competition” between Washington, Oregon, and Canada within the race. This month we turn our focus to the “**IRON TEAM**” Award.

The “**IRON TEAM**” Award, also known as the **2014 Cascade Festival of Endurance Championship**, boils down to a team competition, one of superiority, but also of consistency!! How it works is simply this: Teams accumulate points in each of the three races, the team accumulating the most points is awarded the “**IRON TEAM**” Award. The winning team not only receives the “Iron Team Trophy” but also a **FREE** 2015 Cascade October Enduro Entry!!! Points are earned as follows:

1st – 12; 2nd – 10; 3rd – 9; 4th – 8; 5th – 7; 6th – 6; 7th – 5; 8th – 4; 9th – 3; 10th & lower – 2

There is also a ½ point bonus per number of cars in class (this is for all positions). For example: When there is one car in class, the winner is awarded 12.5 points, whereas when there are 5 cars in class, the winner is awarded 14.5 points. The car that comes in 2nd receives 12.5 points (10 pts for 2nd + 2.5 bonus pts), and so on. In the off chance there is a tie, the trophy and free entry will go to the team that accumulates the most laps in the three races. Next month, we will highlight a little something about each of the three races in the **2014 Cascade Festival of Endurance**.

SCCBC 2014 Event Supplementary Regulations for ICSCC

Your application/entry to the event constitutes acceptance of these Supplementary Regulations. Infractions will result in penalties being assessed to the driver.

1. All events are to be held on the Mission Raceway Park Road Course in a counter clockwise direction.
2. All events will be timed & scored by the AMB Transponder System. Race cars must have an AMB TranX260 transponder installed and operating in each session.
3. Open to cars eligible under ASN Canada FIA, CACC, SCCA or ICSCC current regulations.
4. Insurance shall be as per ASN Canada FIA and CACC regulations or ICSCC as applicable.
5. Drivers must present a valid drivers license as well as a valid racing license issued by ICSCC, ASN Canada FIA (All Regions), SCCA, or NASA. Licenses of other sanctioning bodies may be honored at the discretion of the License Director.
6. All competitors, entrants, crewmembers and guests must sign the official release agreement and waiver.
7. All minors (under 19) require a signed "minor waiver" for each event (available at Registration).
8. Minors (16 to 18) registered as crew or volunteer must have both parents sign an **Annual Parental Waiver**. No one under the age of 16 is permitted in the hot pit area. **No one under the age of 19 is permitted to compete in an ICSCC event.**
9. NSF cheques will be charged an additional \$40.00 Canadian fee.
10. Competitors affected by a race cancellation will be notified by telephone, if possible, or by first class letter.
11. **Consumption of alcohol during an event is NOT PERMITTED at Mission Raceway Park! You are responsible for the behavior of your crew and guests.**
12. Registration & Tech hours and procedures for handling Late Entries as per the race announcement.
13. Driver Services and the Official Notice Board are located in the SCCBC Clubhouse near Pregrid.
14. Novice/License Director will be located just west of the entrance to pit lane.(ICSCC-Pit 1)
15. No racing engines may be started prior to 10 minutes before the 1st scheduled session, then warm as quietly as possible until the 1 minute warning.
16. The scales will be open Saturday from noon and Sunday/Moday all day.
17. No skateboards, scooters, or roller blades. Bicycles and small motorized vehicles allowed by permission of the Paddock Marshall or Steward only. Permission may be withdrawn at any time. **NO ONE UNDER 16 IS ALLOWED TO OPERATE A MOTORIZED VEHICLE!**
18. Both front paved lanes in the Paddock area run EASTBOUND. Rear lane is two way. Speed Limit: 8 kph (5 mph) - excessive speed will be subject to penalties assessed by the Steward. No testing on any facility roadway.
19. Refueling not allowed in Pregrid. Fueling in the Hot Pits requires a crewmember assigned only to manning a fire bottle.
20. NO SMOKING allowed in Hot Pits, Pregrid, or any Mission Raceway Park Building.
21. The Hot Pit speed limit is fifty (50) kilometers per hour (30 mph). The Hot Pit Lane ends at the Starters Tower. Penalties may apply.
22. Entrants may only park support vehicles within their own paddock space. Roads **MUST** remain clear. All Support vehicles and trailers must be parked perpendicular to the track unless permission is obtained in writing from the organizer.
23. No generators may exceed 80 decibels (db) from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM. No generators from 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM. No one may plug into any facility power outlet.
24. No race vehicle may exceed 100 decibels (db) measured at 50ft. from the racing surface. Readings will be taken at an acceleration point. Cars exceeding the db limit will have one or more of their Qualifying times in that session erased, or be *disqualified* from their race.
25. Damage to track, grounds, buildings or equipment, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Damage to paved areas may result in fines. You are required to protect the asphalt from damage by jacks, jack stands, poles, etc.
26. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular group, drivers and cars entered as an "additional entry" will be restricted from participating, based on the date the entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by those for whom the event is their primary event, including novices upgrading to a championship event.
27. All hazardous waste spills are to be reported to the Paddock Marshal. Anyone caught dumping oil will be FINED and BANNED from the raceway. Drivers will be assessed a cost of \$50 per bag for any grease sweep required for fluid leaks or spills anywhere in the facility.
28. **DO NOT BLOCK THE PAVED PADDOCK LANES DURING RACES.** Trailers may be loaded at the back of the paddock.
29. **Tire scrubbing is not allowed at any time during practice or qualifying sessions.** Scrubbing is allowed only on the pace laps preceding the initial green flag starting a race, or under pace car control.
30. No open fires anywhere! Barbecues will be the only exception as long as they are away from any combustible source such as gas cans, gas tanks or fuel cells, etc.
31. No overnight camping at the track Monday night without permission, please contact the SCCBC President.
32. **Gates are closed for the evening at 10:30pm and reopened at 7:00am.** In case of emergency a security guard stationed at the gates will allow access to and from the track. There is a pay phone at the far east end of the spectator parking lot.
33. Sleeved shirts, closed toe shoes, and visible wristbands must be worn and clearly visible in the Pregrid, Hot Pits and Impound areas. Long pants are required in the Hot Pits.
34. Cars arriving at Pregrid after the 5-minute warning will be put at the back of the grid
35. All pets must be on a reasonable length leash while on site.
36. Late Registrations on Monday MAY be accepted, at the Race Chairmen's discretion.
37. Upon exiting the Hot Pit, stay in the dedicated pit-out lane to turn 1. *Failure to comply may result in penalty or exclusion*
38. **All race participants and their race/support vehicles must vacate the premises by 7PM on the final day of each event.**
39. Any race vehicle on the run off road drivers right turn four must come to a stop prior to Turn Station 6 and wait for direction from a Corner Worker prior to re-entering the track. **No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed.** Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
40. Race cars failing to negotiate Turn 1 that do not pass the Commitment Line may re-enter safely at Turn 1. Any race car past the Commitment Line must re-enter safely at Turn 3. **No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed.** Failure to comply may result in penalty or exclusion at the discretion of the Steward.
41. Any race vehicle that exits the racing surface in 7A or 7B must re-enter the track only when safe to do so. **No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed.** Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
42. Vehicles exiting the track via the pit entrance must stay four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line in Turn 9 for the entire length of the white line. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
43. Vehicles not exiting the track must not place four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line in Turn 9. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
44. The SCCBC reserves the right to, at their discretion, refuse entry and/or access and/or remove participants from the Mission Raceway Park.
45. There is no access to Race Control without the permission of Race Control.
46. There is no access to the PA stand except for authorized observers and event personnel.
47. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
48. The 5-minute warning will be given no earlier than 8 minutes before the scheduled race start
