Hello Conference Faithful!

long summer of mostly excellent weather and some great racing is drawing towards an exciting finish. Very few races were heavily impacted by adverse weather this year so that was good for the member clubs that work so hard to make these complex and expensive events happen. The usual race classes have contributed the majority of the entries again this year so all of us here at Conference Headquarters want to thank Pro3, CT4, Spec E46, SPM, Spec Miata and Caterham Cup 4 for their huge support of Conference racing. With only the SCCBC Double Race Event at the Mission Raceway Park Road Course in B.C. September 16th & 17th there are still championships that are yet to be decided and an opportunity to get another ICSCC Championship event on your resume so do your best to support our family north of the border at that event and end the Championship Season with a bang.

After that there is still an opportunity to enjoy one of the more historic endurance events in the country - the Cascade Sports Car Club's Festival of Endurance at PIR on Saturday, October 14th. The premier event is the 8 Hours of the Cascades and if you have never experienced endurance "team racing" you owe it to yourself to experience it at least once in your life. Sprint racing has a tendency towards a "selfish", one on one, short term, aggressive risk and reward types of races. An 8-hour enduro requires strategy decisions on car prep, building a co-driver and pit team, target speeds and aggressiveness levels based on preserving the car, fuel consumption, tire and brake management, and efficient servicing and driver changes. In the end your wins or losses are shared with your teammates which is something rarely experienced in our championship sprint races and something that you are likely to remember fondly for the rest of your life. There are also 2 and 4 hour races happening at the same event that are essentially a "race within a race" so you can dip your toes into endurance racing to see how you like it before jumping into the 8 hour with both feet. Grab your best Conference buddy(s) and enter a car or rent a seat for the 2 hour or 4 hour and go see what endurance racing is all about. Experiencing one of the last "LeMans Starts" left in the world is probably worth I all be itself!

Lastly, a serious subject – It is late August and we haven't located a Steward candidate for next year. For better or worse most of our racers have slowly migrated towards thinking of themselves as customers rather than club members and perhaps as a result volunteerism is at a historic low. Most of these critical volunteers are racers, ex-racers, or people closely associated with racers who give selflessly of their time and effort because they are committed the survival of grassroots amateur motorsports and the people in it. Every one of these VOLUNTEERS does a critical job that makes Conference racing possible yet they are simply club members that pay exactly the same as everyone else for a race entry. As of right now, for next year we have a short list of past Stewards who can handle a Conference race if necessary. Most have served in multiple positions at the Club and Conference level already for many years and it is getting harder to keep going to the well and expecting these folks to continue giving. If none of them want to make that sacrifice on a given weekend, that race will have to be cancelled! I want to commend Brad Greco and Roldan deGuzman for really coming through for us and giving one year Stewarding commitments when we needed them desperately. I also want to thank past Stewards Brad Greco, Rick Delamare, Duane Martinsen, Dave Dunning, Scott Morton, and Terry Overdiek for pitching in to help train and act as Assistant Steward at assorted events for the last two years when needed. When you look at that list of names, I think you will notice that they are all people who come to the track because they want to race which is difficult or impossible when you are Steward. We need to reignite the tradition of volunteer service to the organization and identify some new, quality candidates for the critical jobs with Conference and the Member Clubs. I know not everyone can commit to a big job right now but take a moment and ask yourself two questions that are critical to the survival of Conference. 1) What skills, time, and effort can I afford to invest in Conference and/or my Club, and 2) Who do I know and respect that I think could hold a critical position in Conference and/or my Club to insure the future of amateur grassroots racing in the Northwest for the foreseeable future? I look forward to hearing your answers!



STEWARD'S CORNER

hen you read this, will only be one championship race left in mtherey season as the Race Steward. I think the season has gone pretty well and it's been great to great to get to know more of the Conference community. There have also been some challenges along the way, but even in those difficult moments most everyone has been reasonable to work with.

On another note, seeing and obeying the flags continues to be an issue. At the drivers' meeting in Portland, it was announced that the fines for missing flags would be further increased. It was decided that fines would remain where they are for the time being, though there is a distinct chance that we will need to increase the fines in the near future if issues continue. Fines for repeat offenders will certainly be increased.

One of the reasons flags are being missed is that some drivers are still not understanding their responsibility to see the flags. Our rules state that flag signals are to be obeyed without question. It seems that many drivers still expect the flags to appear in their line of sight. This is not how it works. Drivers must direct their eyes at each manned turn station as they approach each station. As a driver, you need to make checking the turn station part of your rhythm in the same way you would pick out a reference for braking. When in traffic, adjustments need to be made. A driver must consciously adjust how they look at the turn station for status in a similar manner that they need to adjust where they are braking. Remember that observing the flags is as important as not hitting whatever is directly in front of you because sometimes that is all that can prevent you from joining an incident. Another thing to understand is leniency for giving spots back for passes under yellow. This leniency is only extended in situations where cars are in close proximity and it is safer let things settle a bit to prevent cars from colliding due to different reaction times and slowing as the flag is observed. Penalties will still be issued when a pass is conducted simply because the driver didn't see the flag and the position given back later, once the driver realizes that they passed under yellow.

SCCBC 2023 EVENT SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS FOR ICSCC

YOUR APPLICATION/ENTRY TO THE EVENT CONSTITUTES ACCEPTANCE OF THESE SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS. INFRACTIONS WILL RESULT IN PENALTIES BEING ASSESSED TO THE DRIVER.

- 1. Events are to be held on the mission raceway park road course in a counterclockwise direction.
- 2. Open to cars eligible under ICSCC, FIA, CACC, CDN ASN regions or SCCA current regulations.
- 3. Drivers must present a valid driver's license and a valid racin g license issued by ICSCC, CACC & CDN ASN REGIONS, SCCA, OR NASA. Licenses of other sanctioning bodies may be honored at the discretion of the license director.
- 4. Insurance is provided by ICSCC all competitors, entrants, crewmembers and guests must sign the official waiver.
- 5. Any person under the age of 19 who is registered as crew or volunteer must have a parentsigna parental waiver. No one under the age of 19 is permitted in the hot pit area or trackside. No one under the age of 16 is permitted in the pre-grid.
- 6. Consumption of alcohol or recreational drugs during an event is not permitted. Drivers are responsible for the behavior of crew and guests.
- 7. **Registration is located at the2** nd **gate booth.** Registration & tech hours and procedures for handling late entries as per the race announcement.
- 8. Driver services and the official notice board are located in the tech area.
- 9. Prior to 10 minutes before the 1st scheduled session each day, race engines may only be idled to warm, or to report to tech
- 10. No skateboards or roller blades. No one under 16 may ride bikes in the paddock. No one under 16 is allowed to operate a motorized vehicle.
- 11. Both front paved lanes in the paddock area run eastbound. Rear lane is two way. Speed limit: 8 kph (5 mph) no testing on any facility roadway.
- 12. Refueling not allowed in pre-grid or the hot pits
- 13. No smoking allowed in hot pits, pre-grid, or any mission raceway park building.
- 14. Hot pit speed limit is fifty (50) kilometers per hour (30 mph). The hot pit lane ends at the starters tower.
- 15. Entrants may only park support vehicles within their own ASSIGNED paddock space. Roads must remain clear.
- 16. No generators may exceed 80 decibels (db) from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm. No generators from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. No one may plug into any facility power outlet.
- 17. No race vehicle may exceed 100 decibels (db) measured at 50ft. From theracing surface. Readings will be taken at an acceleration point.
- 18. Damage to track, grounds, buildings, or equipment, regardless of cause, will be charged to the driver responsible. Damage to paved areas may result in fines. You are required to protect the asphalt from damage by jacks, jack stands, poles, etc.
- 19. All hazardous waste spills are to be reported to the paddock marshal. Anyone caught dumping oil will be fined. Drivers may be assessed a cost of \$50 per bag for any grease sweep required for fluid leaks or spills anywhere in the facility.
- 20. Do not block the paved paddock lanes during races.
- 21. No open fires anywhere! Barbecues will be the exception but must be away from any combustible sources; gas cans, gas tanks or fuel cells, etc.
- 22. No overnight camping at the track Sunday night

23. Gates are closed for the evening at 9:00pm and reopened at 7:00am.

- 24. Visible wristbands must be worn and clearly visible in the pregrid, hot pits and impound areas.
- 25. If entries exceed the number of cars allowed on the track for a particular group, drivers and cars entered as an 'additional entry' will be restricted from participating, based on the date the entries were received. This is in order to allow participation by those for whom the event is their primary event, including novices upgrading to a championship event.
- 26. All pets must be restrained as per ICSCC race regulation 1603c.
- 27. Upon exiting the hot pit, stay in the dedicated pit-out lane to turn1. Failure to comply may result in penalty or exclusion.
- 28. Any race vehicle on the runoff road drivers right turn4 must come to a stop prior to turn station 6 and wait for direction from a marshal prior to re-entering the track. No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
- 29. Race cars failing tonegotiate turn1 that do not pass the green commitment cone may re-enter safely at turn 1. Any race car past the commitment cone must re-enter safely at turn 3. No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may result in penalty at the discretion of the steward.
- 30. Any race vehicle that exits theracing surface in 7a or 7b must re-enter the track only when safe to do so. No positional advancement or lap time advancement will be allowed. Failure to comply may result in a penalty.
- 31. Drivers may not short cut corners by crossing over curbs. There are green penalty cones in 7b. Intentional wheels on the inside of the curb in qualifying result in a penalty of 5 positions; penalty during a race 20 seconds each time.
- 32. Vehicles exiting the track via the pit entrance must stay four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line in turn 9 for the entire length of the white line. Failure to comply may result in a penalty. Vehi cles not exiting the track must not place four wheels to the right of the white pit entrance line.
- 33. SCCBC reserves the right to, at their discretion, refuse entry and/or access and/or remove participants from the mission raceway park.
- 34. There is no access to race control without the permission of race control.
- 35. There is no access to the pa stand except for authorized observers and event personnel.
- 36. Staggered start and split start requests shall be submitted to the race steward no later than the end of on-track activity on the day previous to the race.
- 37. Live broadcasting is not allowed during the event. This includes Facebook live, periscope etc.
