#### STEWARD'S REPORT

Hello ICSCC family,

We just wrapped up races #12 and #13 at the Ridge Motorsports Park held by IRDC. Hot weather and huge car count – thank you to all the competitors that entered this race. There are some really tight points battles going on, with only one race weekend – The Dash – coming up in September, held by Cascade at PIR.

Back to the Ridge race – I want to make sure all drivers understand that you are 100% responsible for your crew. I had a couple of crew members this past weekend that were disrespectful toward our pre-grid volunteers and refused to follow their direct instruction. That type of behavior will not be tolerated on my watch. Know that as a driver, you can be penalized – with fines, disqualification, removal from the event, or even being blacklisted – as a result of your crew member's behavior. We welcome drivers from all over the Pacific Northwest



and beyond to come race with us, but bad attitudes and disrespecting our volunteer marshals is completely unacceptable.

A recurring theme this year is the talk of protests, and many questions about how protests work. Section 9 of the ICSCC Competition Regulations has all the details about protests, how to initiate them, when to initiate them, and all the other relevant information. If you feel that something may warrant a protest and you aren't sure, find a Steward and

ask. The key is to speak up right away – as a protest related to something that happened on-track must be lodged within 30 minutes of the conclusion of that session.

#### **ENDURO CORNER**

The Northwest Mini Enduro Championship Series (NWMECS) only has two races left in the 2025 season. A one-hour race on September 20<sup>th</sup> and a two-hour race (which counts as two single races) on October 11<sup>th</sup> are all that remain in the season. Both events take place at Portland International Raceway.

Championships in all five classes are still up grabs. Class leaders are Grimsrud and Storgaard (MSR), Knox (MEO), Dawson (ME1), Houlihan (ME2), and Blaine Weller (ME3). A lot can still change with in essence three races to go along with dropped races to be factored in. Stay tuned!

The ICSCC race season officially ends October 11<sup>th</sup> at Cascade's Festival of Endurance. This year is the 50<sup>th</sup> running of the event! The 2, 4, and 8 hour races (all combined into one) at Portland International Raceway present a thrilling endurance challenge, pushing teams and drivers to strategize for long stints, manage fatigue, and adapt to changing track conditions. This format not only tests the limits of both car and driver, but also brings together racers, family, and friends for an exciting conclusion to the season. This is where everyone truly becomes part of the team, sharing in the electrifying thrill of victory or the heart-wrenching agony of defeat. The event features the historic LeMans start, and the 8 hour finishes in the dark and pays prize money.

For 2 hour and 4 hour entries (and broken 8 hour entries), there will be a track crossing at 5:30pm for those teams to exit the track and head home. Come out and be part of the Cascade's 50th enduro!

As a reminder, ICSCC's Enduro License gives experienced racers an avenue to be able to race endurance races (races at least one hour in length) with ICSCC. Whether you're a previously licensed driver or a driver who comes from the budget racing scene, there is a good chance you qualify for the ICSCC Enduro License. For only \$25, drivers with racing experience can be part of a team.

Hope to see some new and old faces in the final two events on the ICSCC calendar.

# ONE-ON-ONE: MEET YOUR FELLOW RACER INTERVIEW WITH GABE TESCH

#### Can you introduce yourself?

My name is Gabe Tesch, and my story is that I've always loved racing, my dad raced vintage cars for a long time so ever since I was a baby I was at the racetrack. When I was 11, I got brain cancer and had to do 48 weeks of chemo and 48 days of radiation. The doctors thought I'd never be able to race a car because they thought I was going to lose my hearing and eyesight.



It took me a long time to even re-learn how to walk again because of where the brain tumor was, it affected all those areas. I guess I just didn't let that stop me because I loved racing and wanted to be a race car driver. After I finished all my treatment I got into go-karts, made my way up the go-kart ranks and then made my way to cars. Then I just made my way through the car ranks also.

#### What has been your favorite career moment to this point?

I think my favorite career moment was probably last year when I actually competed in my first full year of professional racing as a pro driver. Ever since I was a kid, that was the goal — to be a pro driver and I got to experience that last year with a pro team and everything. It was the coolest thing ever. Even just the feeling, I was just so thankful to be there.

# You've raced all over, what is your favorite track and what is your dream track?

My favorite track that I've driven personally is probably mid-Ohio. It's a very technical track and I've always loved the more technical tracks. And the elevation change is really cool. My dream track to go to is probably Spa. That's the track I've always wanted to race at. I've driven it on the sim and it's just so much fun and looks like such a cool place – going up through the mountains pretty much and the trees. I think it just looks so cool.

# ONE-ON-ONE: MEET YOUR FELLOW RACER INTERVIEW WITH GABE TESCH

#### What is your favorite part of a race weekend?

My favorite part of a race weekend is probably race day. There's qualifying and then the other sessions, but I've always just loved race day. I think my race pace has always been better than my qualifying pace so when it's race day that's when I'm always the most confident and excited.

#### What is your advice for new drivers?

Just remember why you started in the first place, because you love it and you want to have fun. So just remember why you decided to go racing in the first place. For me when I got to the professional level and I was racing in Europe I started to forget that. It got super serious so there were times where I was almost sad because you were racing just to win at that point and there's so much pressure. You forget why you're there in the first place, because you love it. And then you almost stop loving it because you're trying to win all the time and that's your only focus. It's always reminding myself that wow, not many people get to do this and I'm of the few people that get to race. I need to remember why I'm doing this in the first place and what made me fall in love with the sport.
