LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

As I write we are only a few days away from our opening day race with Cascade Sports Car Club held at PIR. With just a couple of days remaining before registration closes, we have about 145 entries per day. Group 1 has 33 entries with 25 being PRO3 cars. Group 2 has also 33 entries with all but one being Spec Miata's. Thanks to the Spec Miata tour folks supporting Conference races. Group 3/6 has 20 entries with 8 Caterham's and 4 Formula Mazda's being most of the field.

Group 4 continues to have a good showing of 7 Spec 46's out of 16 entries. Group 9 the Nostalgic series has 14 entries with all 8 Caterham's double dipping from Group 3/6. I feel those are all good turnouts but the most impressive to me are the 13 Novice entries. Our license directors Rob and Christine are going to be busy.



Remember the first couple of race weekends of each year are busy with performing Annual Tech Inspections being performed so please arrive early if possible and bring your patience as we work through that process.

IRDC REGISTRAR: RACE ELIGIBILITY:

All drivers 18 years old and over with a valid unrestricted competition license issued by ICSCC, SCCA, CACC, FIA, ASN, or NASA. Other licenses may be approved by the ICSCC License Director. Drivers 16-17 require additional waivers to participate.

FRIDAY TEST AND TUNE:

Race car test and tune event, rotating groups. Novice license holders authorized by the ICSCC License Director are welcome. Paddock entry restricted to participants, officials, and volunteers until 4pm.

TECHNICAL INSPECTION:

Entries with a 2025 Annual Tech sticker on your logbook can complete your race tech form at registration and receive your weekend tech sticker then and there and be good to go. Drivers without 2025 Annuals must have your car and apparel inspected by an authorized tech official. Tech officials will be roaming Friday evening or bring your car and gear to the scale station area for inspection.

International Race Drivers Club Supplemental Regulations – Pacific Raceways

1. The event is open to race cars meeting current year ICSCC competition regulations.
2. The event is organized according to current year ICSCC competition regulations. All persons entering the event and/or Pacific Raceways property are subject to current year ICSCC competition regulations.
3. All persons entering Pacific Raceways property must sign in on the event waiver document at the main gate and wear the provided wristband on their wrist at all times. An additional minor release form is required for all persons under 18 years old. IRDC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person for any reason without explanation.
4. Minors under the age of 12 must be under the direct supervision of a responsible adult at all times. All Minors are not permitted at any time in any "hot" area without a signed minor waiver (16-17).
5. Persons under 12 years old may not use any kind of wheeled transportation on Pacific Raceways property, including but not limited to bicycles, scooters, motorcycles, skateboards, skates, etc...
6. The paddock area entrance road gates may be locked between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am.
7. There is no parking permitted along the paddock entrance road, or along the fence line at the north edge of the paddock. This is a defined fire lane, any vehicles parked there will be immediately towed with no notice.
8. **5 mph speed limit in the paddock.** This will be strictly enforced.
9. Pets are welcome but must be leashed at all times and under the control of someone 18 years of age or older. Please clean up after your animal.
10. One support vehicle or trailer per race car in the paddock.
11. Authorized vehicles only on the race course at any time. No motorized vehicles of any kind permitted at any time on the race course without permission or authorization from ICSCC officials.
12. **No race car engines running before 9:00 am or after 7:00 pm. Quiet hours are from 10:00 pm to 7:00 am. Please respect and be considerate of the neighbors to preserve our future ability to hold events at Pacific Raceways.**
13. ICSCC event noise rule 1112 is in effect at all times. 103.0 dB @ 50 feet. No exceptions.
14. Positively no dumping of oil or other hazardous substances on Pacific Raceways property. Anyone doing so will be charged with all mitigation costs, could possibly be criminally charged, and will absolutely be permanently banned from all IRDC events.
15. Any damage to Pacific Raceways property and or facilities, including but not limited to the track, barriers, fencing, buildings, etc..., regardless of cause, whether accidental or intentional, will be billed to the responsible person. Likewise, any damage to equipment or devices provided by ICSCC or IRDC regardless of cause will also be billed to the responsible person.
No open fires permitted.
16. Race car traffic only on the pre-grid access road adjacent to the front straight. No street cars, pedestrians, bicycles, etc...
17. No motorized tow or support vehicles are permitted on pre-grid, unless specifically authorized in advance by the Grid Marshall or Race Chairman.
18. Please park support vehicles behind the pre-grid area along the fence line.
19. No refueling on the grid without a dedicated person at the ready with a suitable fire extinguisher.
20. The Turn 1 blend line is in effect. Violations are subject to penalty.
21. Should you happen to use the turn 3A escape road, you are required to stop completely at the end of the escape road where it re-joins the circuit and wait until released safely into traffic by the turn station officials at turn 4. There will be a minimum 10 second hold to adjust for the time gained by shortcutting the circuit, but the wait may be longer until a safe opening in traffic occurs, which will be at the sole discretion of the turn station official.
The race schedule may be altered by the Race Chairman due to emergency conditions.
22. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted at any time during the racing event, and governed by permit conditions during the times when racing events are concluded.
23. No race class changes after 1:00 pm on race day.
24. The authorized location for timing beacons/devices is in the gated area east of the walkway to the turn 9 grandstands. No other locations are permitted, timing equipment placed outside of the authorized area will be confiscated.
25. Requests for split or staggered starts for championship points events must be submitted to the Race Steward 30 minutes prior to the Drivers Meeting.
26. Overnight camping on Pacific Raceways property Sunday night requires permission from track management.
27. Exit to paddock at turn 8, **do not exceed paddock speed of 5 mph.** If returning to race and race damage was repaired, **you must be checked by tech and log book signed.** Proceed to pre-grid, **do not exceed paddock speed of 5 mph.** Before returning to race you **must be cleared by pre-grid** and waved back to track. **Do not exceed pre-grid speed of 5 mph** until you clear turn 1. Any violation of paddock/pre-grid speed will be severely addressed.
28. Drones must be approved by Pacific Raceways and IRDC prior to use, they cannot be flown over spectators or the racing surface.
29. These are the Starter Board messages; this will be on the Start/Finish stand

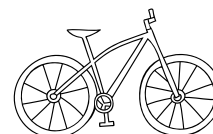

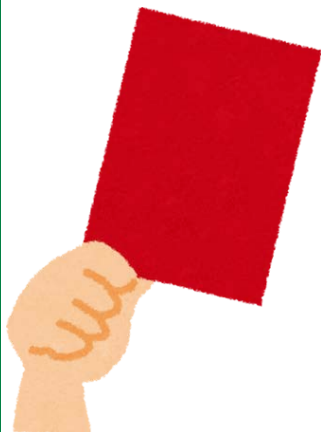

FRESH FACES ON THE TRACK: 13 NOVICE DRIVERS DEBUT AT THE ROSE CITY OPENER

Portland, OR — April 26–27, 2025

The Rose City Opener lived up to its name last weekend, not just in marking the start of another exciting racing season, but by welcoming 13 novice drivers to the paddock—each bringing fresh energy and fierce determination to the Portland International Raceway.

These newcomers weren't just filling out the grid—they were making their mark. With everything from tightly-contested class battles to personal bests and steady progress lap after lap, it was clear that this year's crop of rookies is one to watch.

Diving into the Deep End

For many of these novices, the weekend marked their very first time competing in a full-fledged motorsports event. From early morning drivers' meetings to the adrenaline of the green flag, they navigated the steep learning curve with grit—and more than a few smiles. Some came from karting, others from HPDE programs, and a few were fulfilling long-held dreams of taking to the track in competition.



A Community Effort

Credit is also due to the volunteer staff, corner workers, instructors, and seasoned racers who mentored and supported the novices throughout the event. In paddock and on grid, it was common to see veteran drivers helping rookies with everything from tire pressures to race line strategy—proving once again that the grassroots racing community thrives on collaboration.

Looking Ahead

With one race weekend now under their belts, these 13 new drivers have officially joined the club—and their journey is only just beginning. The next round can't come soon enough, and if this past weekend was any indication, the future of local motorsports is in very good hands.

HOW TO GET A TECH STICKER FOR YOUR RACE WEEKEND

Do you have a 2025 annual inspection sticker on the back of your logbook?

Yes:

1. Take your logbook (with the 2025 tech sticker on the back cover) and your race license with a 2025 gear tech sticker on it to race registration.
2. Registrar will register you for the race and give you a Standard Tech Inspection Form. Complete the form, sign and date it, hand it back to the registrar or tech inspector and you will receive a roll bar sticker for your race weekend. The registrar or tech inspector will also make an entry in your logbook.
3. Put your sticker on the car, on the left side roll bar or on the windshield lower left corner where grid can easily see it. No sticker = frowny face at grid time.
4. You're done – go race and have fun.

No: *(likely for your first race of the season)*

1. You should always try to get an annual inspection because it makes your race weekend so much easier and stress-free!
2. Well before your first race weekend, download from the ICSCC website a 2025 Annual Tech Inspection Form (Don't be surprised if the form still has a 2024 date, it's OK to use)
3. Using the form, inspect your car and gear, pay especially close attention to the typical issues we find like:
 - a. Belts expiry date – check the rules for SFI belts
 - b. Fire extinguisher, condition, legality per the rules and charge state (in the green)
 - c. Battery positive terminal covered
 - d. Required race number on the front of the car
 - e. Brake or rain light as applicable
 - f. Weight sticker
 - g. Class specific issues like arm restraints, window nets
4. If you have questions such as "Does my window net expire" or "when do my belts actually expire per the ICSCC rules" etc., you can read the rulebook, or post a question on the forum, or even Facebook IRDC page or Pro3 page, they are very helpful.
5. Once you are satisfied with the safety condition of your race car, load up, go to the track and find Tech, could be a fixed location or might be roaming. Take a blank Annual Tech Form with you, your logbook and race license.
 - a. Remember to bring your logbook, race license and your safety equipment
 - b. Have your safety gear ready for inspection. Your helmet complies with the latest rules, correct? Find the Snell tag on the inside of the helmet so you can show Tech.

c. Find your ICSCC Conference roll bar stamp – mark it with something so you know where it is and can find it quickly so Tech doesn't spend 15 minutes with you looking for it.

d. You will have to start the car and kill it with the kill switch – take your car out of gear. I laugh because at least once per race weekend, someone tries to start it in gear. You may notice that I no longer stand in front of, nor to the rear of, a car having the kill switch demonstrated.

So, now you are an expert in the safety condition of your car and can show or answer anything asked by Tech.

Tech will ask all sorts of questions like (show me your two throttle springs) or show me the roll bar stamp – this is not a test, it just saves Tech time in having to go look for these things which are different on different car models.

Once all is inspected and looking good, Tech will:

1. Sign the Annual Tech Form
2. Sign your Standard Inspection Form if you have it already (from Registration)
3. Make an entry in your car's logbook
4. Put a 2025 helmet sticker on your helmet
5. Put a 2025 Annual Gear Sticker on your race license
6. Fill out the rollbar/windshield sticker for the race weekend, put it in the logbook and hand you back:
 - a. The logbook with Tech sticker for your car
 - b. Your race license
 - c. The completed and signed Annual Tech Inspection Form
7. Tech will keep the Standard Form and return it to Registration.
8. You will take your logbook and completed Annual Tech Form to the Race Steward and he will put an Annual Tech sticker on the back of your logbook and take your Annual Tech Form.

Now, you have an Annual Tech sticker on your logbook and an Annual Gear sticker on your race license and you are good for the rest of the calendar year.

Per ICSCC rules SCCA/CACC annual inspections (and logbooks) will be accepted.

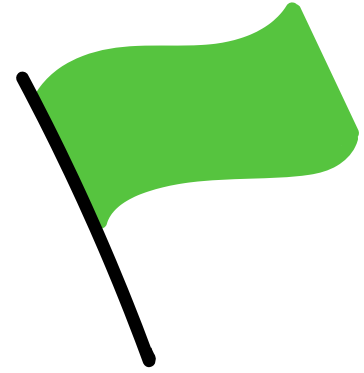
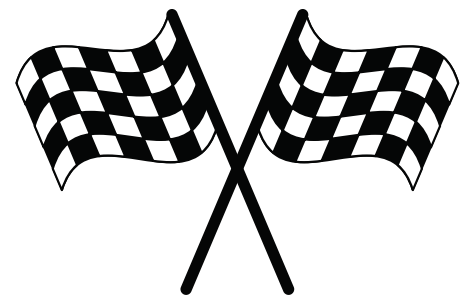
